## THIS WEEK

The tenants of a maisonette development in the Ebbw Vale suburb of Toronto were up in arms last week when news leaked out that the Ontario Housing Corporation proposed to price them out of their homes so as to secure the development for a low-income subsidized housing plan.

The corporation was set up last year by the provincial government to help municipalities speed up the provision of cheap housing for needy families, not only in Toronto. However the need in the capital is the greatest, and some social workers have said 20,000 to 30,000 low-rent homes will be needed by the end of the decade.

Last month the provincial government earmarked \$15,000,000 to build 2,300 new units in Toronto and buy 1,200 more from private owners within two months.

When it was learned that the corporation was to be the first development to be taken over, the district's tenants' association filed a formal complaint, fearing that property values would be lost.

It was then that the OHC had already bought Bernadette's 102 units and proposed to raise the rents in order to move the tenants out.

## HON. HARRY HAYS ON THE FEDERAL DAIRY POLICY

In a statement on the Dairy Policy made this month by Mr. Hays, he said — the objective is a national average return of \$3.50 per hundred-weight for manufacturing milk consumed in Canada.

"I would like to emphasize that this is not a guarantee to each producer but to the industry as a whole. It does not mean that every shipper will receive exactly \$3.50."

"The farmer's total return will still depend on what he does in negotiating the price he gets at the plant."

"The objective of a national average return of \$3.50 will be reached through two direct payments from the government to the producers. Neither of these payments has yet been made."

"The first will be made during the dairy year, starting in a couple of months or so, and the second will be made after the dairy year ends next March 31st."

"The first cheque farmers receive will be a supplementary payment based on the deficiency payment during the last dairy year."

THOMAS S. ELMORE

A native son of Walpole, N.S., who distinguished himself as a Magistrate in the City of Toronto, Thomas S. Elmore passed away last Saturday in Newmar Hospital.
