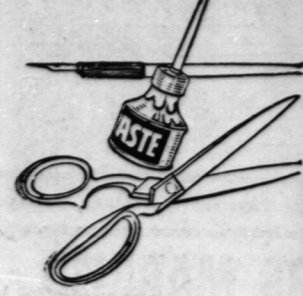


MARRIED AT FISHERVILLE

Fifteen years ago we saw Lake Onaping for the first time. In order to see this awesome magnificence of nature, we travelled the last five miles over a bush road that defied all but the most venturesome souls. The base camp on Lake Onaping, at that time, was operated by a Jarvis Native, Bob Smith and his promotional releases lured hundreds of Americans into the wilds of Ontario. Not too many Canadians accepted his invitation to see and enjoy Nature in the raw. It was the American tourist and his dollars that kept these places going.

Fifteen years later, 1965, shows a transition that is almost unbelievable. The American Tourist is still taking advantage of the pleasures derived from visiting this area but the more intrepid Canadians will soon begin to enjoy the pleasures that had formerly missed. The reason for this is that the Ontario Department of Highways, due to a progressive policy established by the Hon. James N. Allan while Minister of Highways, is building a new road from Sudbury to Timmins. This highway will run the length of Lake Onaping on the west side

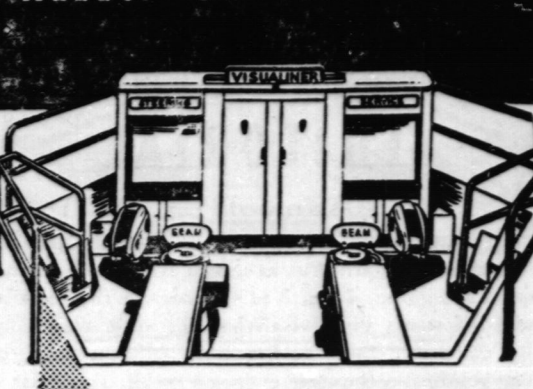
and open the whole area up for Ontarians. Even now the road that once looked hours to travel to the bottom end of the Lake has been improved to the point that the full speed limit can be maintained without difficulty. The result is that now hundreds of people are flocking in to Lake Onaping to enjoy the wonders of the area. When the road is completed the more venturesome will be gone. Although Bob Smith no longer

operates Camp Onaping he retained a three acre island where he had built a cabin that will accommodate twelve people. It is called Rabbit Island because of the number of snowshoe rabbits that inhabit it. It is located twenty-five miles from the base camp on the Lake that runs northward and is equipped with six double bunks with excellent mattresses and plenty of wool blankets. There is also a kerosene stove, a wood fired cook stove and a wood fired heater, an electric refrigerator and a kerosene fired refrigerator. The latter is the necessary staple for food eating. There is also a 2500 watt electric generator that anyone that might suddenly find themselves in this particular area in the dead of night would not be disappointed. A Broadway could be found in the northwoods.

This is where we spent last week. The weather was perfect, the food was good, we fished for six days in the best fishing spots to be found anywhere. These included Lost Bay, Whitefish Lake, Green Bay, Long Lake, East Bay and Dog Lake. It is not likely that any more than a dozen people, except the native Indians, ever fished in Dog Lake. A hidden stream flows into Green Bay on Lake Onaping that leads to a small lake. The stream is barely navigable. However, an expert like Bob Smith knows how to do it. After winding past huge rock boulders on the bottom of the stream you finally emerge on a pot hole as it takes nearly two hours to fish around its shoreline.

As we mentioned earlier it is, primarily, the Americans who enjoy the wonders of this area. We would imagine that ninety percent of the tourists in the Onaping area are from New York State, Ohio or Michigan. In fact it was our pleasure to share our experience

NEW FOUR-YEAR AGRICULTURE PROGRAM FOR ONTARIO SCHOOLS

In September, a new blueprint for Agriculture will be presented to the schools of Ontario. For the first time, students will be able to take Agriculture as the major subject in the Four-Year Science Technology and Trades Program and qualify for a Secondary School Graduation Diploma at the end of Grade 12 with the designation of "Agriculture".

The announcement of the new policy was made by the Hon. William G. Davis, Minister of Education, in a speech at the Fergus High School on March 10, 1965.

Mr. Davis said, "The new program will place emphasis on technical and business courses to remain on the farm. It will include the science-based courses in Agriculture introduced in 1962. The new Four-Year Agriculture Program is tailored to meet the needs of the students who plan to return to the farm and the new diploma will provide an incentive for more pupils to remain in school to the

16 graham wafers (crushed to fine crumbs)
1/2 cup brown sugar
1 tsp. cinnamon
1/2 cup melted butter

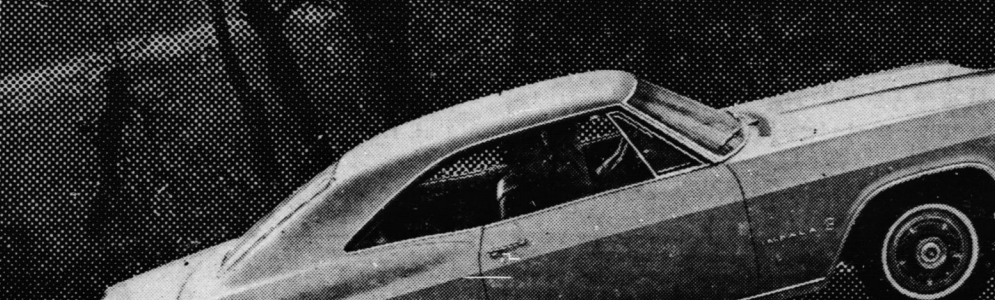
