BRANTFORD MAN, 87, BADLY BURNED

Almost half of the Toronto buseomen who become pregnant have an abortion instead of a baby, a report in the Ontario Medical Review said last week. Official police estimates compare 35,000 abortions with the total of 41,210 live births for 1964. The police said as well that only 5,000 of the abortions were procured by professionals and the remainder were either self-induced or accidental. Hospital sources added that of 333 obstetrical deaths between 1958 and 1963, 69 (one in five) followed illegal abortions over the past few years and five more were convicted of manslaughter in this connection.
