The election of Canada will go to the polls on November 8th for the fifth time in eight years. The announcement was made by Prime Minister Pearson on Tuesday night.

Conjecture as to the possibility of an election has been in the wind for the past few weeks despite the fact that the Prime Minister had said on June 29th there would be no election this year so far as the Government was concerned.

Newspapers and other media almost without exception, have been critical of the holding of an election now in view of the fact that representation will be based on the 1961 census. Critics of the Government announcement claim redistribution of the Prime Minister's decision to call for a vote at this time.

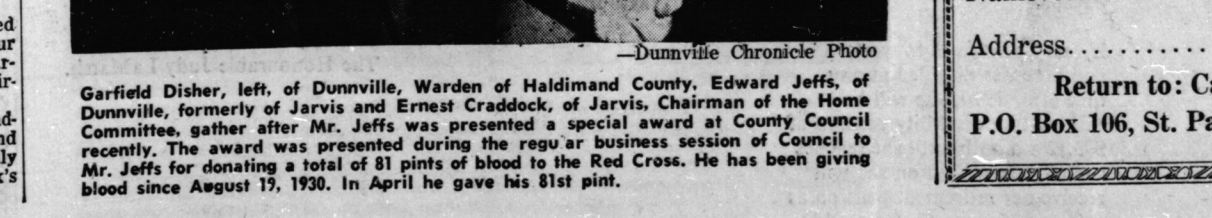
