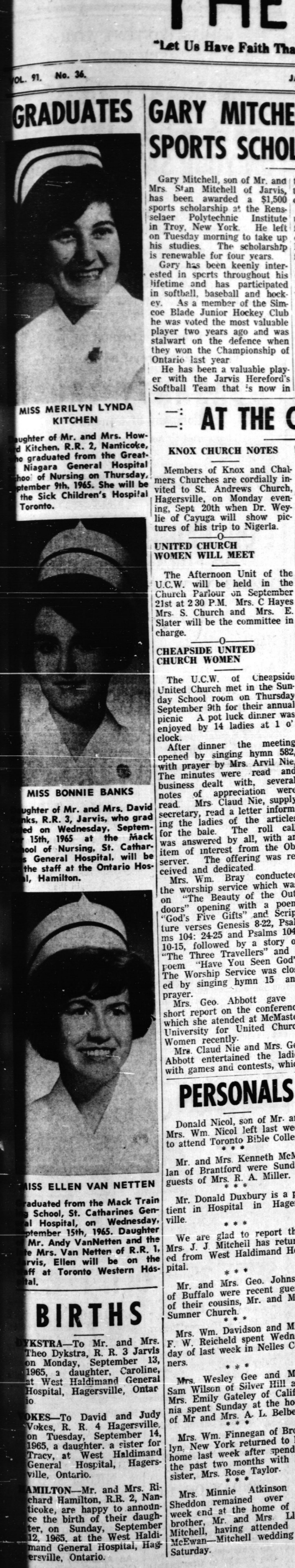
HEREFORDS WHIP SARNIA TO WIN SOUTHERN ONTARIO O.R.S.A. SEMI FINALS

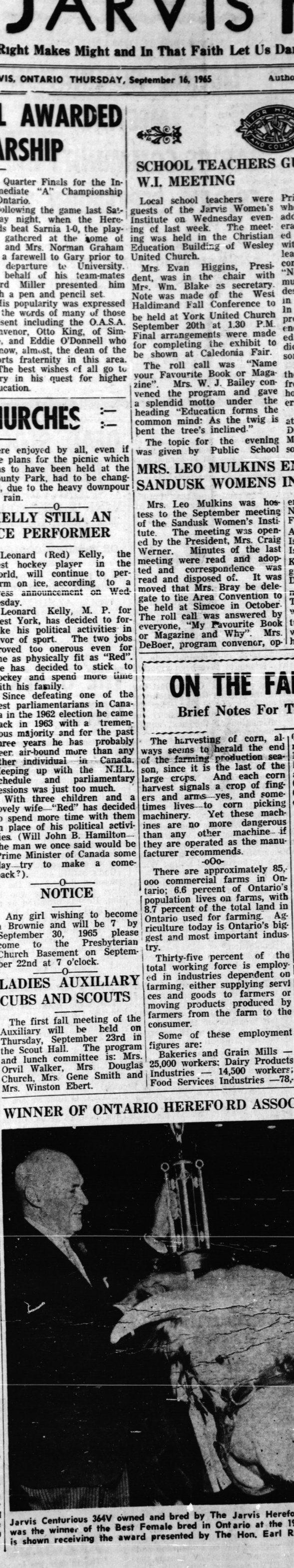

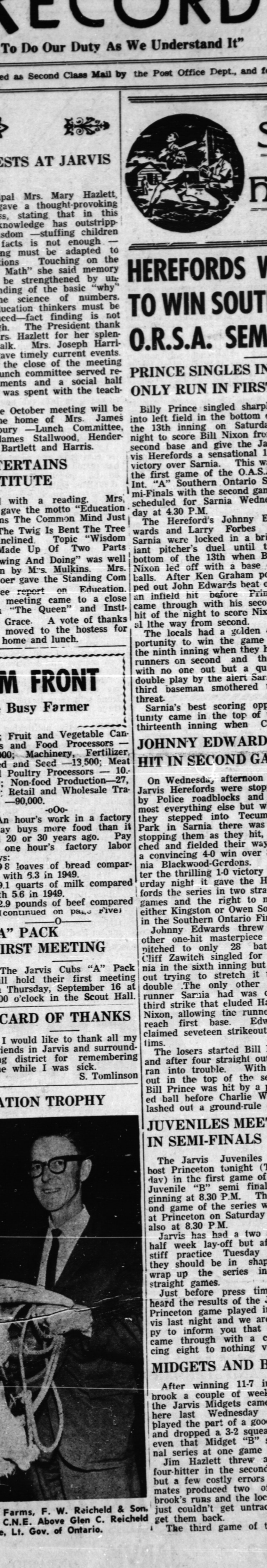
