Architects' Sketch of Proposed New Hagersville High School
The following is a brief description of the proposed new Hagersville Secondary School. The school will be located on Parkview Drive on a site opposite the new West Haldimand General Hospital; it will have composite facilities, and it will accommodate 1,110 students with ultimate expansion to 1,200. During the initial planning stage, the Architect, Shore & Moffat and Partners, carried out research into air conditioning costs. As a result of this research, the school will have fixed windows of limited size and full air conditioning for approximately the same cost as the more usual large open windows and a smaller amount of mechanical ventilation.
