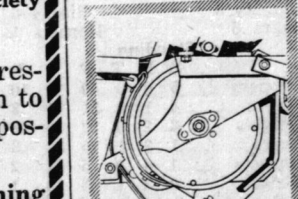
TRUSCOTT REPORT IN P.M.'S HANDS BY TODAY

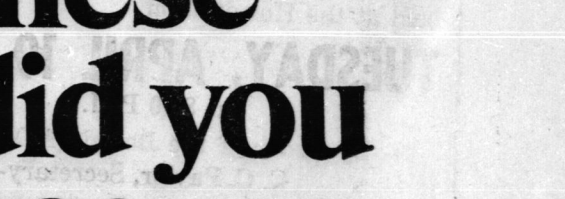

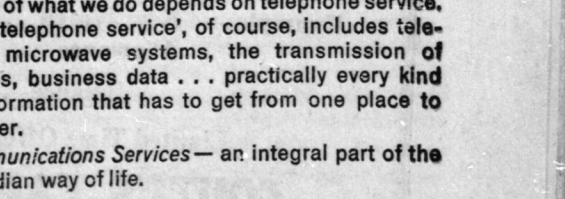
