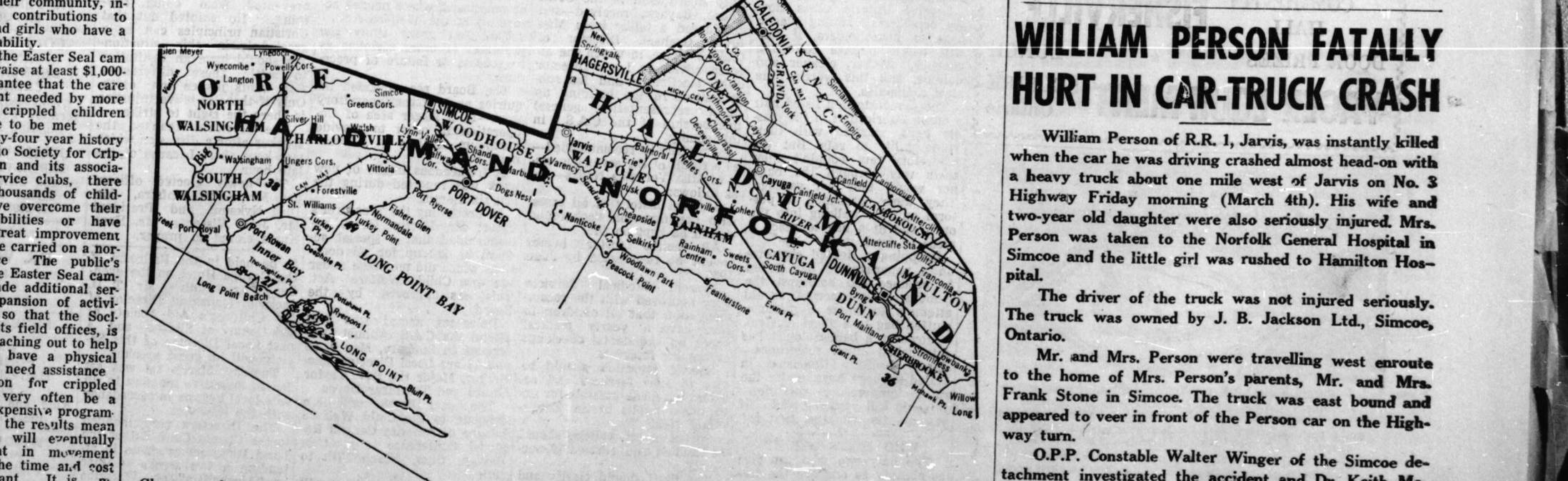

WILLIAM PERSON FATALLY HURT IN CAR-TRUCK CRASH
 William Person of R.R. 1, Jarvis, was instantly killed when the car he was driving crashed almost head-on with a heavy truck about one mile west of Jarvis on No. 3 Highway Friday morning (March 4th). His wife and two-year-old daughter were also seriously injured. Mrs. Person was taken to the Norfolk General Hospital in Simcoe and the little girl was rushed to Hamilton Hospital.

WILLIAM PERSON FATALLY HURT IN CAR-TRUCK CRASH
 The driver of the truck was not injured seriously. The truck was owned by J. B. Jackson Ltd., Simcoe, Ontario.
 Mr. and Mrs. Person were travelling west enroute to the home of Mrs. Person's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Frank Stone in Simcoe. The truck was east bound and appeared to veer in front of the Person car on the Highway turn.
 O.P.P. Constable Walter Winger of the Simcoe detachment investigated the accident and Dr. Keith McIntosh, Coroner, was also at the scene.
 Funeral arrangements were indefinite at time of going to press.
