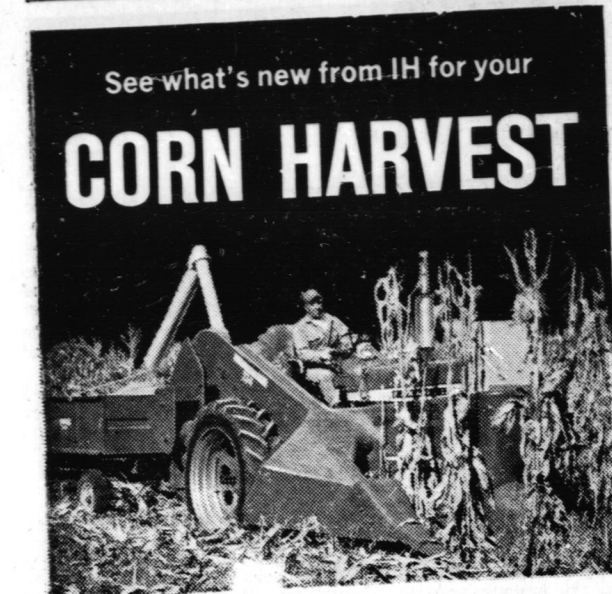

MILK PRICES - WHO IS RESPONSIBLE?

Considerable confusion has arisen about which level of government is responsible for the existing federal and provincial dairy policies. Hopefully, this kind of confusion will be prevented when the proposed national dairy commission legislation, now awaiting the attention of Parliament, becomes operative. In the meantime, however, federal Agriculture Minister J.J. Greene, and his provincial counterparts, are to be wise and read again his announcement of the new dairy policy in the House of Commons on March 23. There is a significant difference between that statement and one made in mid-June.

The confusion hinges on shipping costs being charged against dairy farmers, a question which provoked the Ontario tractor demonstrations. In June, Mr. Greene told the Commons, "... my information is that there are complaints with regard to some processors who have raised the price of milk. The Ontario milk marketing board has set the price at \$3.95 and it is apparently felt that this raising of transportation cost will ultimately result in the producer receiving less than \$4. With respect to the cost of transportation, we, of course, have no control over this, but I sincerely hope that adequate action to make the \$3.25 price effective.
