**ADDITION MOOTED FOR GRANDVIEW**

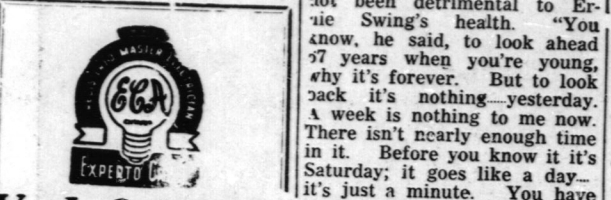
