other Jacques. They established themselves at Khedive and their influence was felt in the development of that area from the early years of this century. The Grandsons of the late Thomas Jacques still operate the farms at Khedive.

The other family we set out to see at Khedive was the Goodfrey Thomas Sanders family. T. Sanders came to Canada in 1912 under the auspices of the late George L. Miller and Lt. Col. Fred Goodfry. George L. Miller met Tom Sanders at Halifax, along with a number of other immigrants from England, at Halifax. They came to the Jarvis area and were placed with local farmers badly in need of help. Tom Sanders went to work for the late W. J. Saunders in Walpole Township, and faithfully served him for 3 years. He then went into the service and served in their finest Great War. Returning, he travelled west to Khedive, Sask., and until 1955 he was one of the foremost citizens of the Khedive district.

It is amazing how things turn out when one is travelling. We were trying to locate the two families we have mentioned. After travelling a few hundred miles across the broad Prairies, we finally came to the conclusion we were lost and stopped at a farm home to ask directions. The man we stopped to see was Mr. George Atkins, Box 144, Khedive, Sask., and when we told him the places we were looking for, he turned and said "See those trees over there that were at least two miles away) and when we said yes, he said "well, that was where Tom Sanders lived and I knew him from 1924 until the time he died. The Jacques's, well, their farms were directly west - right over there where that clump of trees stand." So we saw the two layouts we had travelled from Brandon to Khedive to see all in one grand sweep.
