The Record is in receipt of a letter from The Honourable James N. Allan, M.L.A. for Haldimand-Norfolk which should bring a measure of relief to the citizens of the Village of Jarvis.

The existing structural condition of the roads is very poor, mainly as a result of recent heavy rain. The Department has recognized the need for improvement. Unfortunately, however, the need for improvement is being delayed by the fact that the Department has been unable to obtain the necessary funds to carry out the work.

This is good news. Citizens of the Village have been most tolerant of the period of many months they have realized, we are thankful to say, that we would have to go through a period of tribulation to amend for the short-sightedness of those in authority in times past.
