FOR A FIRE SAFE CHRISTMAS

Choose a "fresh cut" tree with high moisture content. Store the tree outdoors. Make a diagonal cut at least 2" from the butt before setting the tree up indoors. Stand the tree in a container, that holds plenty of water. Refill the container each day. Use only electric lighting sets that bear a mark of approval and inspect for damaged and frayed cords. Use one amp fuse on electric serving your tree. Use glass wool or asbestos "wool" in either non-combustible material in decorating the tree or your home. Dismantle and remove the tree as soon as it has served its purpose.

To choose a fresh cut Christmas tree — bend the needle gently. If needle bends instead of breaking, the tree can be termed "fresh cut". Should the needle snap, it indicates a dry and brittle state and is not suitable.

A CHRISTMAS LETTER FROM PRISON

The following is a Christmas letter written to his parents on December 17, 1943, by Dietrich Bonhoeffer, a German minister and theologian, imprisoned by the Nazis for his opposition to the Hitler regime. His words may be of help to those who have to spend Christmas in hospital, prison or under the burden of a little bit exaggerated to you — sickness or sadness.

THE FESTIVAL OF CHRISTMAS

Christmas is above all a portrayal of the wonder that is Christ. We are to celebrate it as first and foremost as the incarnation of Christ, the feast of God becoming man. He is forever "tabernacled among us". Christmas is a "tent" of old test signified the temporary nature of our sojourn on earth. While all things pass away, the most significant present fact is that God who inhabits eternity, dwells also with people of contrite hearts.

Christmas is a time when Christ tells us that people count, not because they are good or bad, black or white, rich or poor, but simply because they are human.

Therefore Christmas is the festival of human dignity. Christmas is a time to tell an aged person we are glad he is alive. Let us take time to thank God and go on living to love those who need human love.

Christmas is not just for children (bless them — their "Merry Christmas" look even brings joy to faces that seldom smile) but, the core of it is something very adult, making us men of good-will, and not just for one day, but an essential something to take hold on every day one after another as long as they come.

Christmas is the first principle of the rudiments of Christ — himself is dwelling in us at this hour — He is out there in all the turmoil of this troublesome world — and He is alive. Let us take time to thank God and go on living to love those who need human love.

And this is something to be joyful about — it is what makes sense of all traditional Christmas forms of joyfulness.

"THE" PERSON

Wars and rumours of wars, taxes and more taxes, corruption in high places, lust for power, rising costs, toppling of values, exotic and unusual changes and styles, violence, rioting and destruction, loss of respect for law and order, if these are the things which come to mind and fill your thoughts when you try to take a distant place. It was not a government or union of nations. It was this and is today A PERSON. Because, like His Heavenly Father, He came into the world, we are able to join with all the blessed humans before our time and proclaim that "Now we find that the law keeps slipping into the picture to point the vast extent of sin. Yet, though sin is shown to be wide and deep, thank God His Grace is wider and deeper still. The whole outlook changes — sin used to be the master of men and in the end handed them over to death; now Grace is the ruling factor, with righteousness as its purpose and its end the bringing of men to the eternal life of God through Jesus Christ our Lord." (J. P. Phillips, Romans 5: 20-21).

The old fashioned King James translation is much more marvellous in its pointlessness: "Where sin abounds, grace doth much more abound."

Look directly at the dark, threatening clouds of this world, and be a witness at Christmas to the Lord who did not write off such a world as not worth such a world as beyond redemption, who did not judge human beings as without hope, but candidates for the life of God's people as they realized the greatness here is insignificant.

"On Christmas Eve I shall be thinking of you all very much, and I want you to believe that I too shall have a few hours of real joy and that I am not allowing my troubles to get the better of me."

"When one remembers the time of terror so many are having in Berlin, it brings home to one more than any thing else how much there is to be thankful for. It will certainly be a quiet Christmas for everybody, and the children will look back on it for long afterwards. But for the first time, perhaps, many will learn the true meaning of Christmas" (Letters and Papers from Prison - p. 26).
