CAYUGA DETACHMENT O.P.P. WEEKLY REPORT

(Intended for a previous issue) Tremendous improvement in the number of accidents is reported by the Hamilton Automobile Club as follows: for the 72 hour span from midnight Friday, September 1st to midnight Monday, September 4th, over the Labour Day weekend, there was a total of 125 traffic accidents in the Counties of Wentworth, Brant, Halton and Haldimand. This was a decrease of 92 over the same holiday weekend last year. For the three major holiday week ends in 1967, Dominion, Civic and Labour Day holiday week ends, traffic accidents declined by 93, major accidents declined by 128, minor accidents increased by 25, injuries increased by 37 and fatalities
