On fiscal 1967. Already in effect are a four-cent tax increase on a packet of 20 cigarettes, two cents on a gallon of gasoline, and one cent on the monthly watered at rate, the only local bottle in Ontario.

From July 1, Ontario Hospital Services plan premium will go up \$2.25 monthly for single persons and \$4.50 for families. This affects almost every family, as 99.2 per cent of Ontario residents belong to the plan, which pays the cost of hospital treatment.

Twenty-nine (29) young men from Korea will be spending a year in Ontario starting about the end of December. By that time, a one month orientation course will have been completed following which each trainee will be placed on a dairy farm for a full year of practical experience. Suitable family-sized dairy farms are now being sought. Those local farmers who may be interested in taking part in this program could enquire of the local Extension Branch office for details.

MILK PRICES UP
Two Ontario dairies last week announced plans for increasing retail milk prices. Leo Sullivan, vice-president of the Borden Co. Ltd. of Toronto, said its increases would be effective Monday of this week, and D.F. Coy, Ontario manager of Silverwood Dairies Ltd. of London said that similar increases would be made for his company.

Sullivan said that a quarter of homogenized milk would cost 31 cents in stores and 33 cents for home delivery. Two-cent increases. A three-quarter would cost 71 cents in stores and 85 cents for home delivery.

COMPENSATION URGED
Compensation to victims of crime was advocated by a report presented to federal and provincial governments last week.

Drawn up by a 22-man study group after two years of work, the report recommends that each province introduce a publicly administered system of compensation to its victims of crime.

The compensation would cover victims of violent crime, not just the violent types as existing plans dictate. It would also be valid regardless of financial need.

Victims would be eligible for compensation whether or not criminal charges had been laid, and the compensation itself would cover everything from property loss, physical injury and loss of income to legal fees incurred either as a direct result of the crime or in connection with compensation.

Among other recommendations, the report said that corporations and business firms should be excluded from compensation, although a limit should be set on what they could receive.

The report was not a government study. Those who worked on it are members of the Canadian Corrections Association, a voluntary national body of people active in rehabilitation and penology.

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SCHOOL COSTS INCREASE

BUDGET UP \$336,000.00

The West Haldimand District Board of Education has approved a \$1,577,000 budget for the current year.

The board serves the Caledonia, Hagersville and Cayuga areas, and has an enrolment of 1,750 students.

The budget shows an increase of \$336,000 over last year. The increase is attributed mainly to teachers' salaries.

A decision was made to hire two secretaries for the school area and a night watchman for the Hagersville High School year. The increase is attributed mainly to teachers' salaries.

The Board accepted the recommendations of 10 teachers, effective June 30th.

Salaries paid to teachers in the 1967-68 school year were \$1,029,000. Management chairman Roy Adams of Cayuga reported that salary negotiations are under way but the board's request of a \$6,300 minimum to \$12,900 maximum was rejected.
