A MODERN VIEW OF FAITH

In the current issue of a magazine by Leslie Dewart, a professor at St. Michael's College, Toronto, in this article he presents what can be described as a modern view of faith. The author is a Dutch Roman Catholic philosopher who is particularly well known for his work on the existence of such a Person as our Creator, Believer and asking His help. This Person, of course, is the Being Whom we call God. Before Him we have the choice of two alternatives. Either we worship Him as God, or we defy Him.
