The working hours of an employee shall not exceed eight in the day and 48 in the week. However, under certain conditions a permit to work overtime may be obtained from the department. Employees whose only work is supervisory or managerial are exempted from the hours provisions of the Act. A girl under 18 years shall not be required to work more than six hours overtime each week.

NURSING DEPARTMENT Nursing is arduous work, en-tailing a great deal of self sac-rifice in both physical and men-tal energy. This is an estab-lished fact, whether the nurse is employed in a 50 bed or a 500 bed hospital. No one could measure the devotion to the patient given by any nurse dur-

patient given by any nurse dur-ing her daily tour of duty. Most nurses accept the coun-less steps, the heavy lifting the incessant demands on her the incessant demands on her as part of her vocation, a vo-cation whose rewerd is to be found in the satisfaction of a job well done and the peace of mind which comes from un-selfish service and devotion. selfish service and devotion.

Nursing service is a large department in a hospital; in our hospital it embraces Operating Rooms, Central Supply, Delivery Room, and the Emergency Department, also the patient floors. This service requires a total staff in the hospital of eighty people, half of whom are registered nurses, the remainder consisting of register. are registered nurses, the re-mainder consisting of register-ed nursing assistants, nursing aides, orderlies, and ward cler-ks. This department is under the control of the Director of Nurses, who is assisted by su-pervisors, all of whom are well qualified to hold these impor-tant positions. Education and inservice training is carried

vacations with pay

The Act provides that every employee shall be given an annual paid vacation of at least one week after one year of employment. The vacation pay rust not be less than 2% of the total pay received in the year in which the vacation is given. When an employee works for a period less than one year he is entitled to 2% vacation pay for the period worked. After three years of employment, the minimum is two weeks paid vacation and the pay must not be less than 4% of the annual earnings. The Vacation with Pay stamp book system for construction workers will be phased out between January 1, 1970 and June 30, 1970.

NOTE

There are some industries in the province under the jurisdiction of the Federal Government such as banks, airlines, railways etc. These industries are covered by the Canada Labour Standards Code and are not under the jurisdiction of this Act. If you are in doubt which legislation applies to you, call the Employment Standards Branch (Telephone: 365-5251), for information.

Employers are required to provide a statement of wages and deductions to each emand deductions to each employee at the time wages are paid. It must show: pay pariod, rate of wages, amount of wages, all deduc-tions and the purpose of each, allowances and the net amount being paid the em-ployee. Deductions include those authorized by the
