When you have a new job you can keep insured by following the instructions on the Hospital Insurance "Certificate of Payment Form 104" that your present employer is required to give you on leaving.
When you turn 21 you are no longer covered by your parents' Hospital Insurance. You must take out individual membership within 30 days. Get your application form at a bank, or a hospital, or from H.I.R.B.
When you move to a new job you can keep insured by following the instructions on the Hospital Insurance "Certificate of Payment Form 104" that your present employer is required to give you on leaving.
