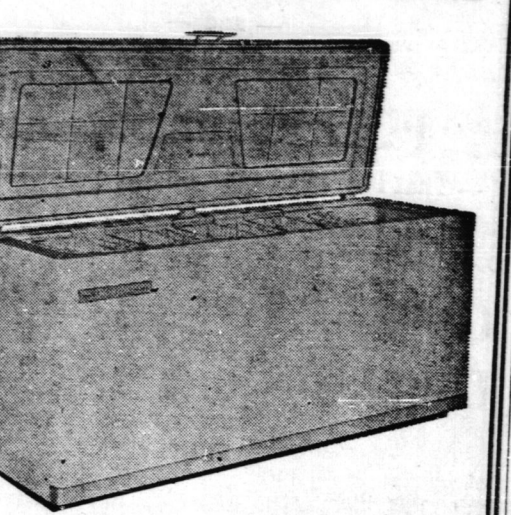

## HOSPITAL NOTES

Even though the birth rate has been on the decline in recent years, maternity care accounts for 15.5 per cent of all hospital days in Ontario's public hospitals last year.

The West Haldimand General Hospital, said his hospital came close to the provincial average. Births in 1967 represented 13 per cent of all hospital admissions, he said.
