

## THE EDITOR'S COLUMN

A recent poll taken in Canada of the popularity of the three major parties in the current Federal Election gives the Liberals 50%, Conservatives 25%, and New Democrats 16%. The remaining 9% consists of Social Credit and other minor parties. Some doubt must be cast on the validity of such polls, in regards to the questions that were asked, who conducted the poll, what cross section of the population was sampled in the poll, and when the poll was conducted.

It is obvious that a poll can be slanted to read the way the pollster wants it to read. For example a poll could be conducted in an area which has voted predominantly Conservative for the past twenty years which would show Conservative points ahead of the other parties. Polls can be misleading because they are conducted within a few days or weeks of a leadership convention when everyone in the country is interested in one political party and have had little exposure to another political party.

If a poll was conducted among the younger voters we are sure that it would show results heavily favourable for the results are announced.

Some people may interpret this article as sour grapes for it is well known what party this paper supports. There may be a hint of sour grapes but what concerns us more is the fact that when people read these polls they may consider their vote of little importance since the person who they might vote for will have little meaning. This is the part of the polls that we dislike the most for everyone should feel that their vote is important and must be cast.

The same factors effect these people who are actively working for and supporting one particular party. When a poll is released the edge is taken off the competition because they feel that the time spent on supporting one candidate will be of little value, because that candidate is hopelessly behind or out in front.

We are sure that as Canadians do not want our elections won or lost on the basis of a poll but rather on the individual vote of each of its citizens.

Phony bank inspectors who use voters lists to get the names of potential victims bilked two pensioners for a total of \$1,200 in Cayuga and Welland, last week.

The culprits made several unsuccessful attempts in the Simcoe and Brantford area before they hit Cayuga and Welland on Thursday and Friday.

The Cayuga victim was an elderly lady. She received a phone call from an "inspector" who said he was checking for counterfeit money. He asked the woman if she had any cash in her house.

When told she did, the "inspector" said he was sending a teller to pick up the cash and check it.

While the woman was still on the telephone, the "teller" arrived and collected \$300. The "inspector" told the woman this was an easier procedure than to have her read the serial number of the bills over the phone.

The teller left, and it was the last the woman saw of her.
