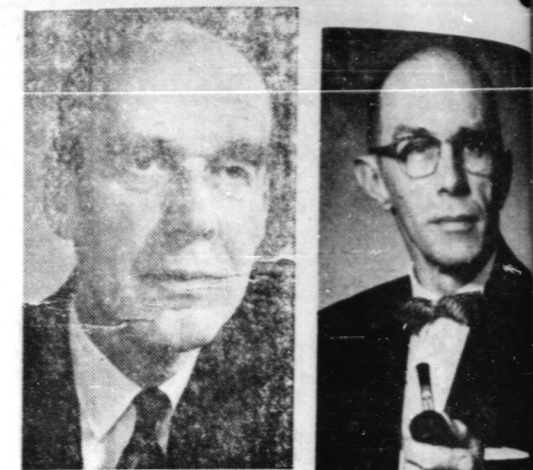

A VIEW ON THE ELECTION

Never in the recent history of elections has the outcome been more uncertain than in the forthcoming Federal election. Obviously the Government, under Pierre Trudeau, decided to appeal to the electorate in the belief that Trudeauism generated by his great appeal in the Liberal Leadership convention would win for the party a majority Government which had eluded Mike Pearson in three elections.

This again, obviously, was a Party decision and no one can even tell whether or not it was done with the blessing of the Prime Minister of Canada, Pierre Elliott Trudeau. On the other hand we have that segment of the Progressive Conservative Party who are annoyed at Conservative leader Bob Stanfield for not forcing an election last February when former Prime Minister Diefenbaker says there would not have been enough Liberals left for need.

It's hard to know what might happen in this election! Pierre seems to have captured the imagination of the majority. How many of this majority are below voting age is hard to determine. It would seem that of all the elections we can remember, emotionalism is a great deal more rampant. Nor voters will elect a Government - nor, indeed, will emotional middle-agers. We talked to a woman the other night who was strong for Trudeau. We asked why? She said why do I have to have a reason why I just want a change.

It scares us to have such determination for the future. Guilt of our Country. Surely Canadian citizens are capable of better reasoning than this. John Diefenbaker, for example, was rejected by the voters of Canada, but we've never heard of ten years from now - or perhaps even now - a majority of people in our Country are re-assessing the great good he brought to our Nation.

The present Prime Minister of Canada is without doubt a man of tremendous intellect. He is competing with a man who has proved himself in the field of industry, employment and administration. Bob Stanfield has accepted the responsibilities of "doing" in the Can-

adian Society. He has proved himself. Tommy Douglas for the N.D.P. turned out to be the best guess on a National TV show. Tommy is a Pro.

Now we suppose, it all depends on which chair you sit. Your own problems in life will probably determine where your political considerations will rest. We only hope that determination will not come from emotional considerations alone. You do have a duty, however, and that is to vote on June 25th, 1968.
