EXTENSION UNDER WAY

Work has begun on the extension and renovation of St. Paul's Parish Hall. Provision is being made for a 40 foot long basement room, with a new kitchen, vestry and wash-rooms, and an assembly room 26' x 52' for use of Sunday School nurseries. The total assessed value of that land was, in 1877, \$2,214.84, of which only \$165,500 was of personal property. The population then was 6,000. More than today.

Since that period in 1877, the township of Walpole has seen little progress. The rich clay soil has provided one of the best agricultural areas in the Dominion of Canada. Industry, however, avoided the district. Now this may be changed.

H. N. Griffith, President of the Steel Company has revealed the interest of his Company in this area. Some details have been revealed which suggest that a Plant costing in excess of \$100 million will be built in the area and will employ up to 3,000 people in the late 1970's.

The value of annual production at full capacity is expected to be in the neighbourhood of \$200 Million.

More than 100 land owners and more than 100 Cottage owners will be affected if the options are taken up.

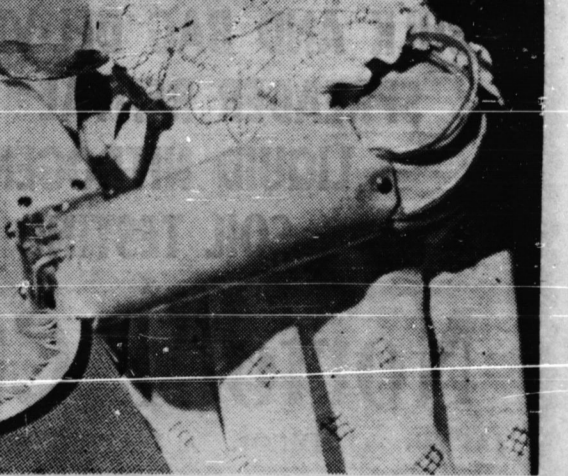
