THE EDITOR'S COLUMN

Over the past five years many changes have been made to the local community with the addition of water and sewage works, new streets, new sidewalks, new street lights and new buildings. Some of the old character of the Village has obviously been lost with these changes. Many of the stately trees lining the thoroughfare have been eliminated, the boulevards have been narrowed, the cenotaph has been relocated, and some of the old buildings demolished or remodelled. These changes are but a few of the changes that can be expected over the next five to ten years.

The construction of the Hydro development project at

Nanticoke and the planned expansion of Stelco on the outskirts of the Village will undoubtedly create and demand many more changes. As we write this article we contemplate what the forthcoming changes will entail.

By 1970 the Hydro project expects to employ 1500 men in the construction of their plant. Stelco will undoubtedly require an equal number of employees in their construction phase and at least that many men on a permanent basis. New industry of a related nature will also be attracted to the area which will add many more men and women. These people will require housing. We have heard it said that within 20 years the expected population of Jarvis will be close to 300,000 persons, a far cry from the population, currently of 800. 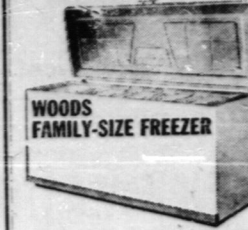
