## THE EDITOR'S COLUMN

We agree with Prime Minister Trudeau's stand on the current situation in Biafra. Canada, in our opinion, has a right to intervene in a civil war within another nation unless they have interests to protect or Canadian citizens to defend. Tribal wars have existed in the African nations since time began and they will continue to exist until the weaker tribes have been defeated by the stronger tribes.

Who are we to say which side is right and which side is wrong when we are far removed from the country involved with little direct interest until the current civil war developed. There is no doubt that everyone the world over deplores the suffering that must exist within Nigeria and Biafra. Surely the people of Biafra must have known the consequences when they decided to split the old country of Nigeria into another state called Biafra. Surely they knew that Nigeria would oppose the division of the country into two separate states just as the Americans did when the South decided to form their own country separate from the North. It is most difficult for the Biafrans to surrender at this time for it only points out that their decision to form a new country was wrong and strongly opposed by their fellow countrymen.

By providing airplanes to lift supplies to those who are starving and wanting medical attention is commendable as long as it is sponsored by an international organization such as the Red Cross. To morally judge whether the Biafrans are right or wrong is a question that can be answered in an individual's mind but it cannot be answered by the leader of any one particular nation. If all nations agree that what is happening in Nigeria and Biafra is wrong through an organization such as the United Nations then steps should be taken to reconcile their differences until peace is obtained. If an individual feels that the Biafrans are right then they can go
