Chairman Assails Publicity

The Haldimand County Board of Education met in regular session on Tuesday, April 15. In his opening remarks Chairman Jackson commented on the publicity which the Board is currently receiving. Although the gravity of the current tax situation is recognized by the Board, the chairman felt that some of the problems could not be related to future development of Regional Government. It seems some people are pre-judging both County Board and Regional Government prior to these

bodies having had experience. The Board appointed on its vice-principals, Mr. Carl Gilmore, as a principal in one of its public schools. In its resolve to provide education for all school age pupils in Haldimand County, the Board of Education accepted responsibility for home instruction. Pupils who are confined to their home or to a hospital for a long period of time will, on approval of a medical doctor, receive regular visits by a certified County Board and Regional teacher. The continuing rise of

pupil population in Caledonia is again creating a crowding situation. After careful consideration, approval to purchase a portable at a price of \$6,950.00 was given.

The Transportation Committee reported that eight tenders had been received for the purchase of North Cayuga and Rainham buses. The North Cayuga buses have been sold to McLeod Motors and the Rainham buses to Mr. Robert Lindsay, Nanticoke. Both already operate routes in the county. The Transportation Committee will attempt to bring about a saving in transportation costs by initiating a system in the Eastern part of the County whereby public and secondary school pupils ride the same bus. Although this may create inconvenience, it is felt that the saving will more than offset the problems created. If the experiment proves successful in the Dunnville area, the Board hopes to introduce this plan into other parts of the County at the opportune time.

The Cayuga Kinsmen Club has requested approval to erect washrooms, dressing rooms snack bar and bleachers on the school grounds adjacent to the old High School in Cayuga. The Kinsmen Club will be responsible for the maintenance of these grounds.

The Director explained, for the information of the Board, the plans that the former Retarded Children's Education Authority had made for the construction of a new school in the Cayuga area. The plans were circulated among the Board members and general discussion ensued.
