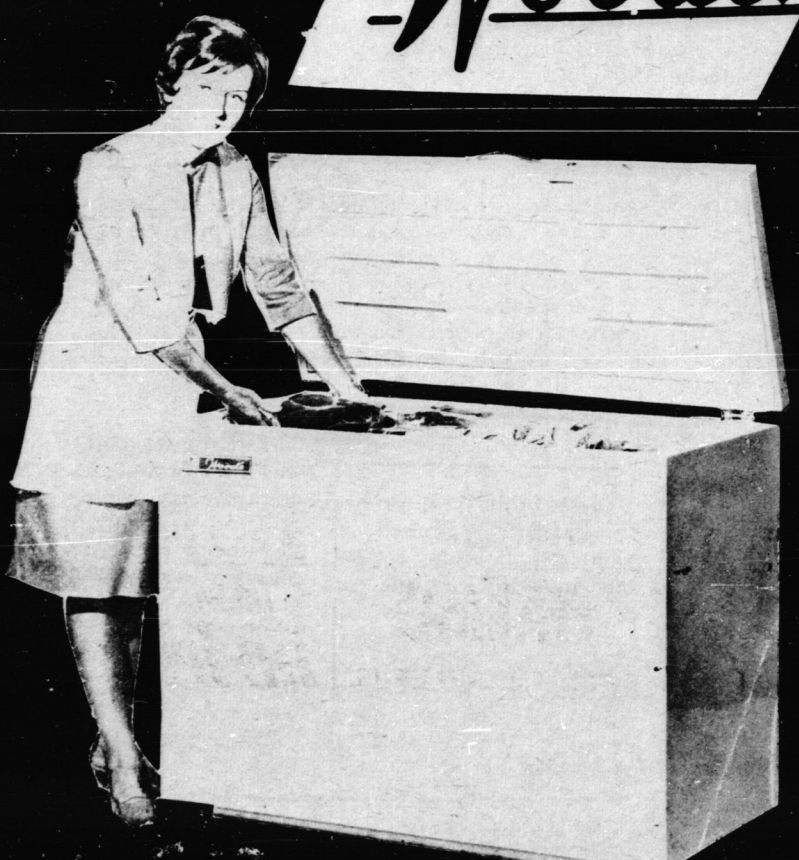

Saskatchewan Farmers

Over 5000 angry but determined prairie farmers are driving their tractors at a slow pace on the highways in Saskatchewan, protesting the lack of government action in grain sales and prices.

A few years ago federal and provincial governments urged farmers to grow more wheat — promising it would be sold. The farmers complied with the request, but the promises failed, leaving prairie grain growers with huge two year crop stockpiled and in detrimental financial difficulties.

Walter Miller, President of the Ontario Farmers' Union, recently travelled the prairies for a full week to address afternoon and evening meetings of anywhere from 300 to 500 farmers. Mr. Miller urged all farmers from coast to coast to support the prairie farmers in their endeavour to have \$200 million pumped back in the farming economy, along with the grain growers' demands that full authority be returned to the Canadian Wheat Board, and that the newly established National Grain Council be discontinued immediately. Farmers believe that the new National Grain Council, strongly influenced and controlled by the Grain Corporate empires, works detrimentally to the welfare of the farmers. Mr. Miller said he believes farmers in Eastern Canada should realize the serious circumstances of the grain problem and how it may well affect them, for in desperation the Western farmer will turn to any type of production that will raise a dollar — including livestock.

Mr. Miller said, "The grain growers on the prairies are angry, determined and anxious to solve their own problems. There is tremendous support for a National Farmers' Union all across the prairie provinces, and the founding convention of the NFU, July 30 and 31st promises to be an eventful history-making day. There is no doubt, in my mind, but that we have entered into a complete new era in the farm

organization history, where collective bargaining for farm products will be a reality in the near future."

Mr. Miller concluded, "Only farmers united as farmers, without any outside influences, can solve the farming industry's problems. The present number of 5000 tractors on the highways could very well triple in the next few days."
