Ham, Macaroni and Cheese, Company Style
1 cup macaroni
½ cup finely diced cooked ham
¼ cup grated cheese
1 can sliced mushrooms (drained)
2 tsp. butter
1 can cream of mushroom soup
½ cup milk
1 cup grated Cheddar cheese
buttered bread crumbs

1. Cook macaroni in boiling salted water according to directions.
2. Brown ham, onions and mushrooms in butter.
3. Add the soup, milk, and ¼ cup of grated cheese, and stir over heat until the cheese melts.
4. Combine the cheese sauce and macaroni, and pour into buttered baking dish.
5. Sprinkle top with bread crumbs and top with the remainder of the grated cheese.
6. Bake at 350 for 30 minutes.

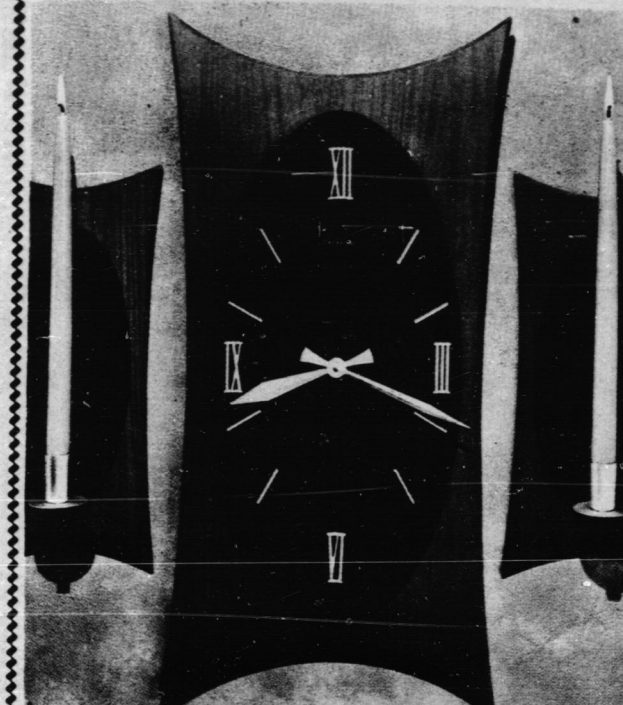
