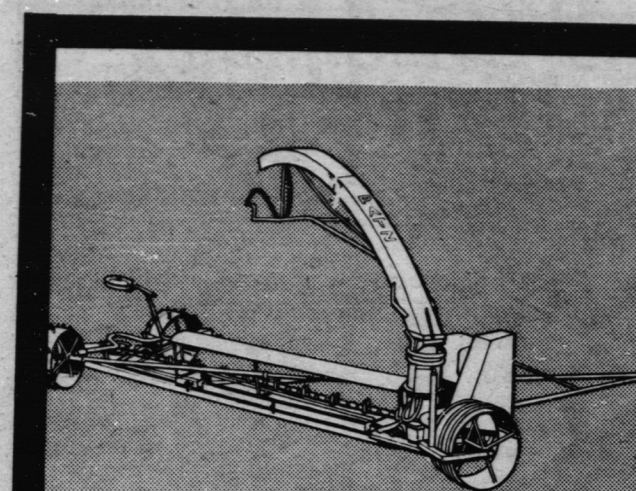

Both the Reserve Grand Champion and the winning three-year-old are by Longpark Bonheur Reflection.

Rowntree Farms Grand Champion bull was the winner in the class for two-year-olds and over. He is Haigertee Dale Ruben, an aged bull with plenty of length, strength of top, exceptionally good in the rump and loin, and moving well. The Reserve Grand Champion, Romandale Bonheur Regent, stood next to Ruben in class for Romandale. He is a well developed two-year-old. Agro Acres Marquis Lad, a very dairylike, senior yearling bull, was Junior Champion for Douglas A. Gregson, Hillsburg, with the Reserve Junior award going to Howard Tarzwell, Georgetown, on the first prize bull calf, Surodana Marquis Apollo.

Romandale's Junior yearling, Romandale Reflection Desiree, took the Junior Championship with the Reserve Junior award going to her paternal sister, Romandale Reflection Daffy, who headed the senior yearlings. Both are by Romandale Reflection Marquis, who also sired the Junior and Reserve Junior Champion bulls and the Grand Champion cow.

Glenafton Farms took the Get-of-Sire class on a group by Thornlea Texal Supreme that included the first prize two-year-old heifer, Howard Laidlaw won the Breeders Herd on a well-balanced group headed by his first prize three-year-old.

Douglas Gregson had a well deserved win in the Progeny of Dam class on the two-year-old and three-year-old daughters of Oak Knoll Bubbles.

The winner in the Inter-Breed Best Udder Class was Clairdale Citation Clara, a purebred Holstein cow owned by Glencloskey Farms, Queensville, Ontario. As a four-year-old in 350 days on twice-a-day milking, Clara produced 18,907 lbs. milk containing 706 lbs. fat, average test 3.73% butterfat. This record has a Breed Class Average of 156% for milk and 157% for fat.

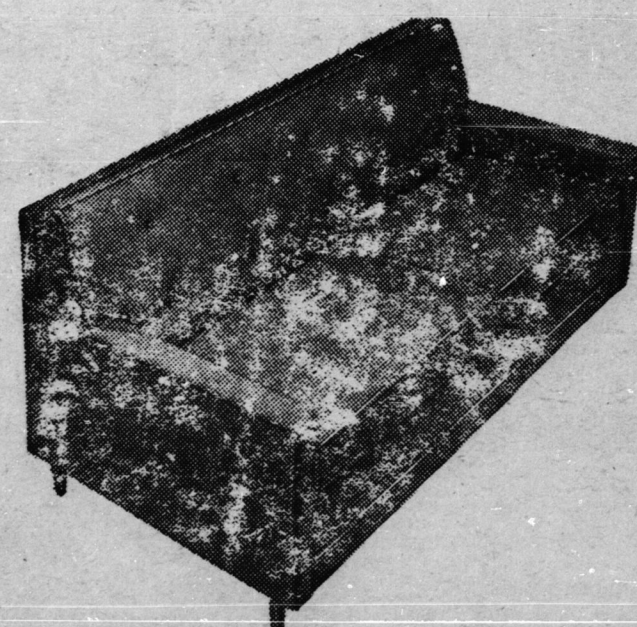
