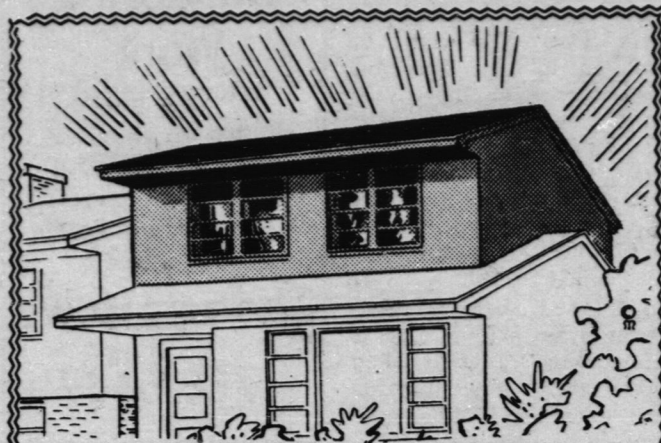

The first game of the series was to be played on Tuesday night in Abbingdon and the return game will be in Jarvis on Friday night at 8:30 p.m.

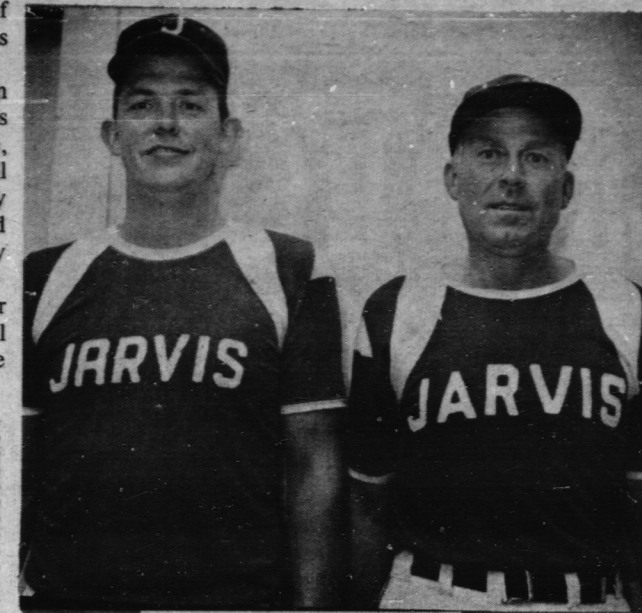
Jarvis got to the finals by eliminating Otterville in two straight games in the semi-final series.
