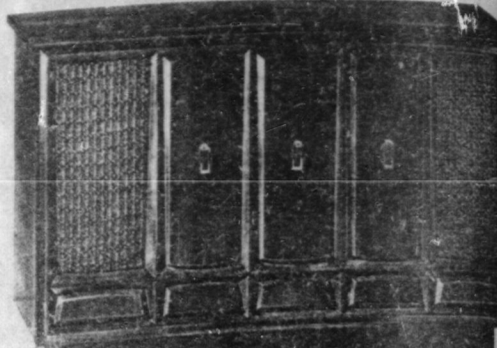

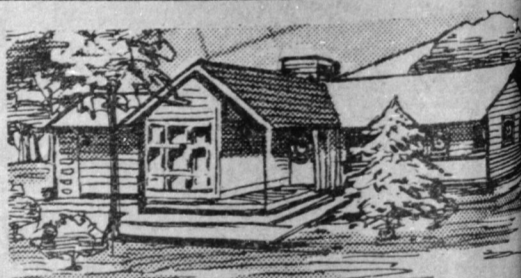

Music For Stenographers

HAGERSVILLE — Light classical music plays a major part in the secondary schools commercial stenography courses here.

Some 100 pupils in grades 10, 11 and 12 have access to \$20,000 worth of equipment and are typing their way to music programmed to pace them at 60 to 120 words a minute on the keyboard.

The equipment used, consists of three tape recorders 30 head sets, a record player, a transmitter, a three-channel selector and a 200-foot loop antenna that encircles the room.

Pre-taped instructions or music sets the pace depending on what segment of the course is being studied.

Should one section of a class be just learning the basics, another, the semi-advanced, and the third, the advance stage pupils of the course, all can receive their instructions individually by using a course channel selector.

In the event the students are all at the same level of learning the instructions transmitted are all the same.

Periodically the instructor will interrupt the tape to have the students correct or evaluate their work.

In addition to the typing course instruction is given in

Three Wolves Shot In Walpole

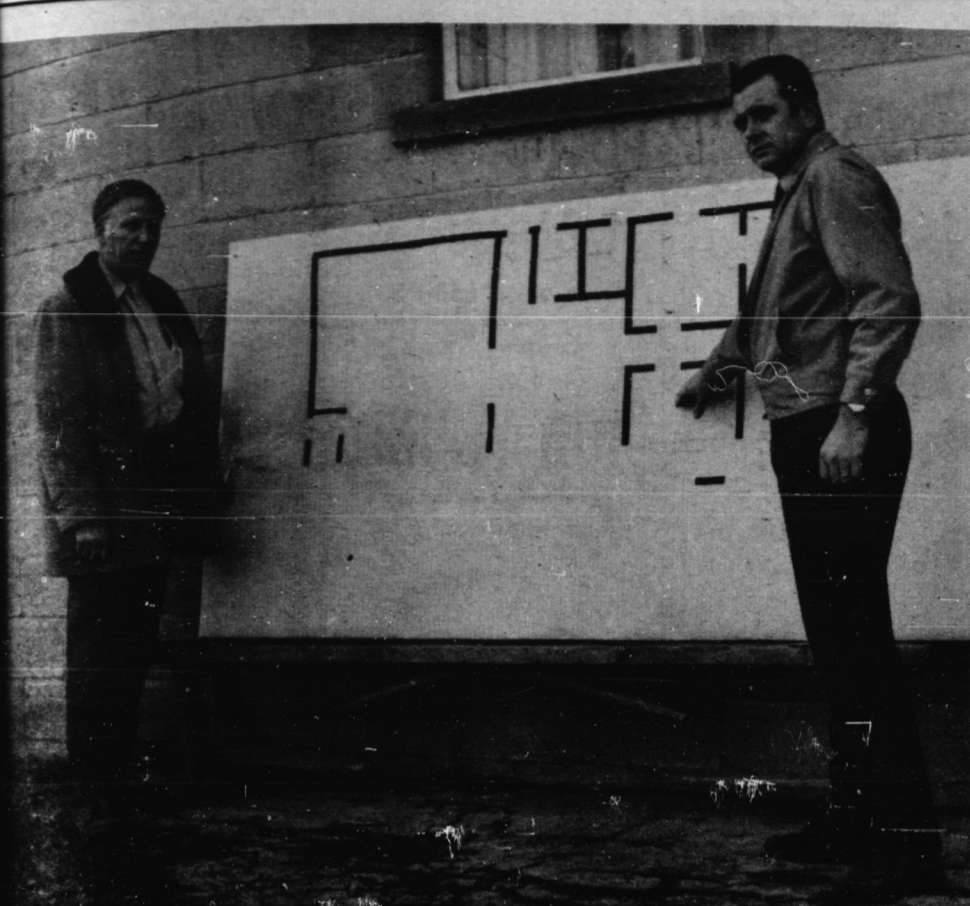
A group of hunters Saturday bagged three of four wolves spotted in Haldimand county near the Lake Erie shoreline.

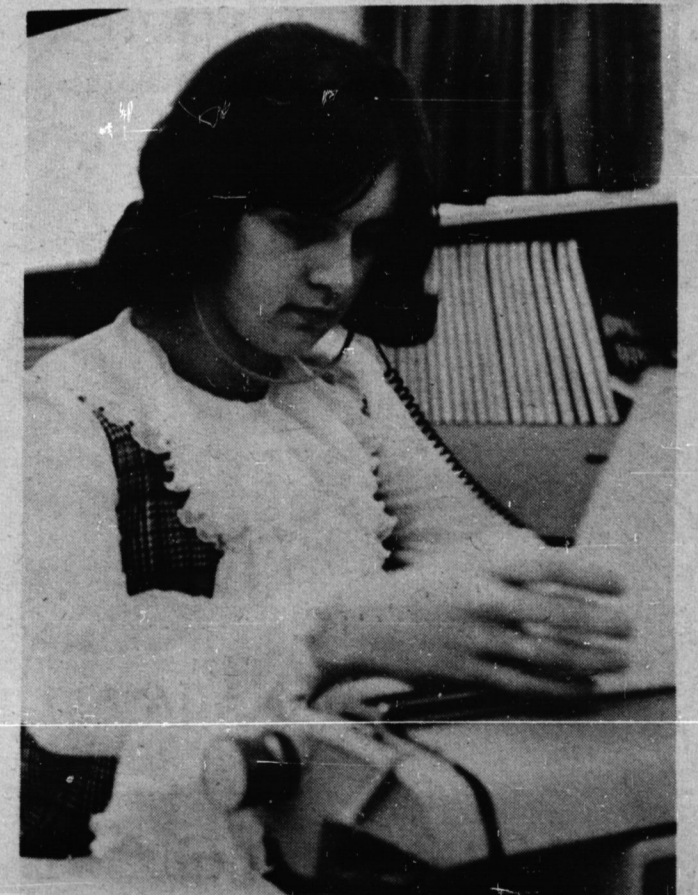
Ratepayers Save \$11,500

A project by students of the Hagersville Secondary School has saved area ratepayers an estimated \$11,500.

Technical Director, James Demaline, said the cost of the structure will be some \$3,500 and estimated the cost at \$15,000 if it had been constructed by a private concern.

The 34' x 24' building was built by part one and two occupational classes and students from grades 11 and 12 farm mechanics.

Students from the Cayuga high school specializing in electrical courses wired the unit.
