QIC Questions And Answers

Q. Unemployment available to me at a location where a strike was on, would I be disqualified for benefit if I refused employment with that company?
A. No. Under the Unemployment Insurance Act, employment that has been made possible because workers of a certain company are out on strike, or locked out, as a result of a labour dispute is not deemed suitable. Therefore, no disqualification would be imposed.

Q. I have been laid off by my employer for a period of two weeks only. Do I have to be available for a permanent job before I can qualify for unemployment insurance benefits?
A. No. When a worker is laid off by his employer for a short period of time, he proves his availability for work — as required by the Unemployment Insurance Act — by indicating his willingness to accept temporary work of a suitable nature.

Q. For years I have been listing my wife as a dependent, but now she has started working part-time. Can I still show her as my dependent?
A. Your wife can be considered as a dependent for unemployment insurance purposes if the total of her part-time earnings plus any benefit she is entitled to for a particular week does not exceed \$26.00.
