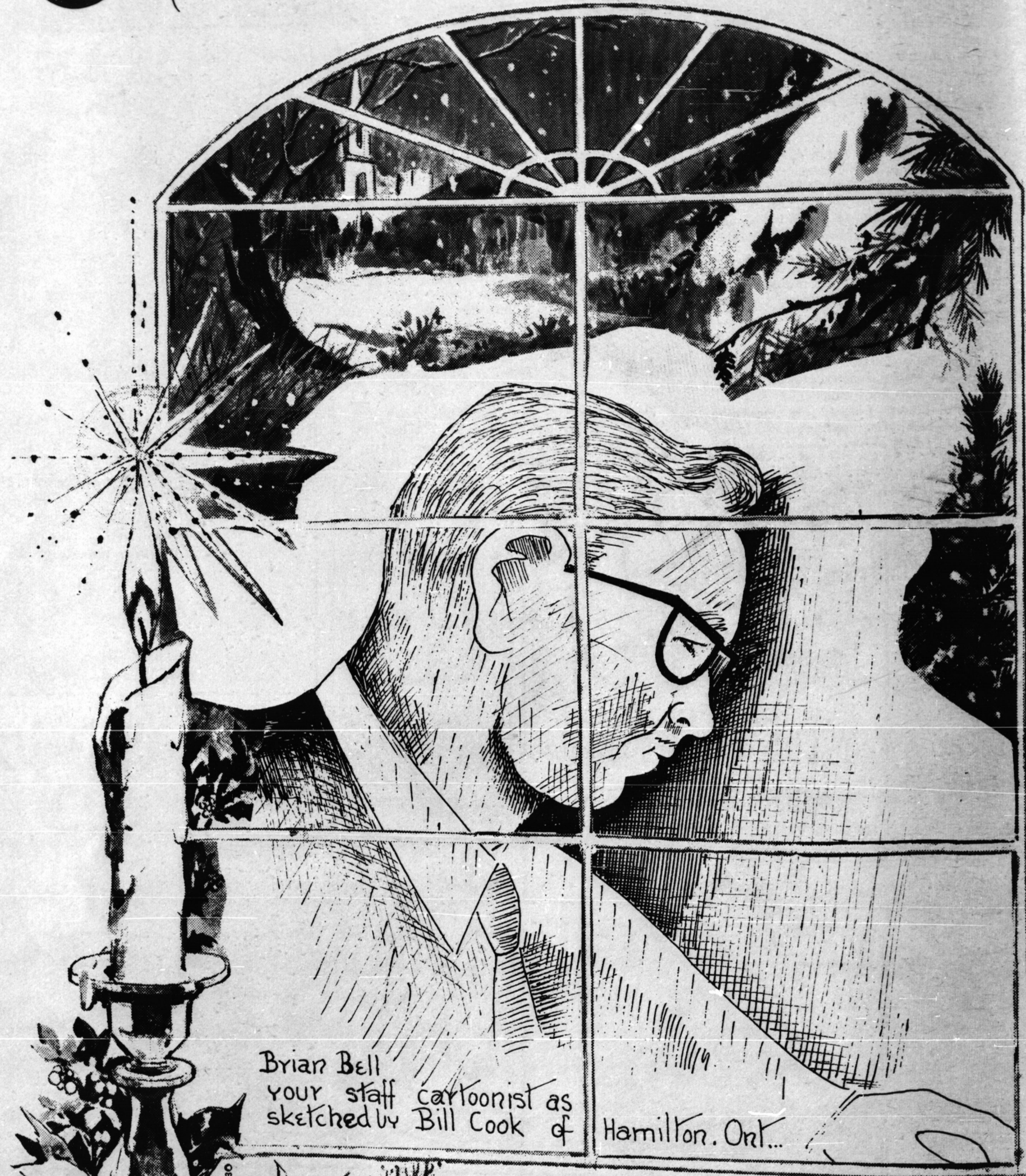
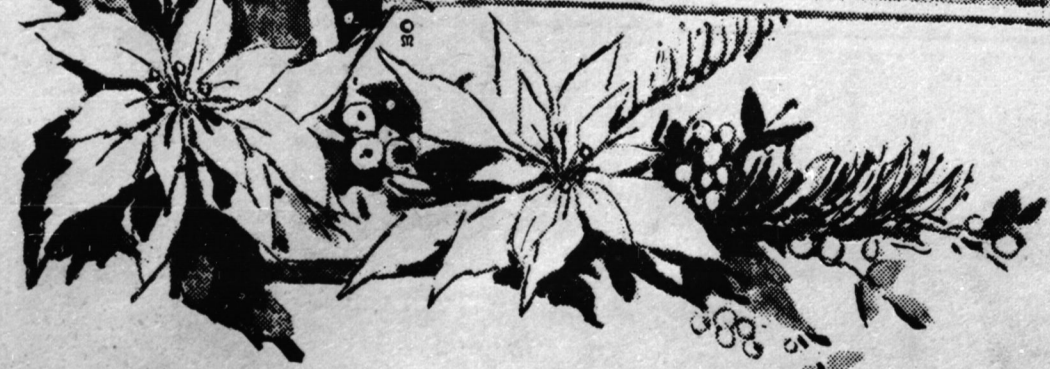

Madonna, Child Inspire Glass Art Through Ages

STAINED GLASS WINDOWS by the hundreds depict scenes of the Nativity. Perhaps the most favored subject for these windows is the Virgin Mother and Child.

IN MEDIEVAL TIMES, stained glass art reached its peak. A simple sincerity characterizes early windows, such as the Madonna and Child window shown above, at right. No Road Blocks

HAGERSVILLE — Chief of police Ray Holden said city police tactics will not be employed here in reference to the setting up of road blocks to give breathalyzer tests.

The chief said his men have been instructed to have a "little closer look at the actions of drivers."

In the event a driver is suspected of being impaired, he will be asked to blow into a special bag which will later be tested by Ontario Provincial Police at Cayuga to determine if he is impaired.
