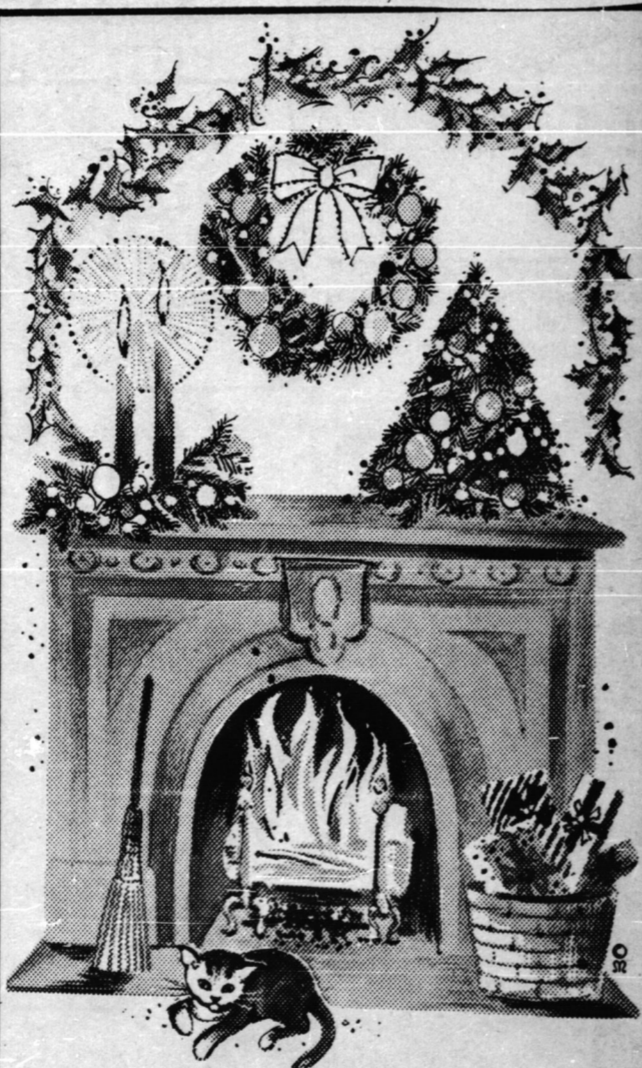
The topic "The origin of Christmas" was read by Mrs. Ford. Mrs. Wm. McMurchy gave the courtesies.

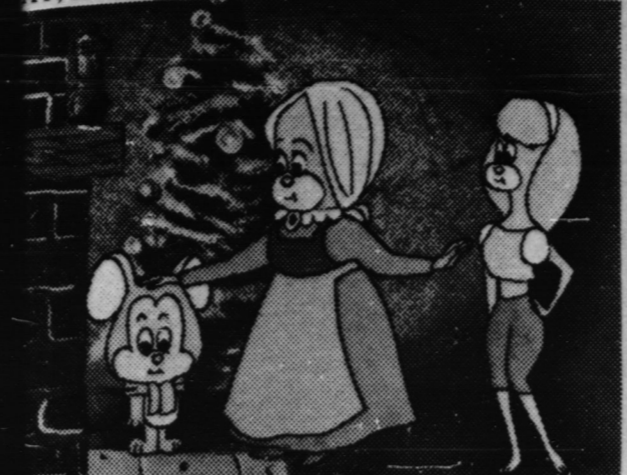

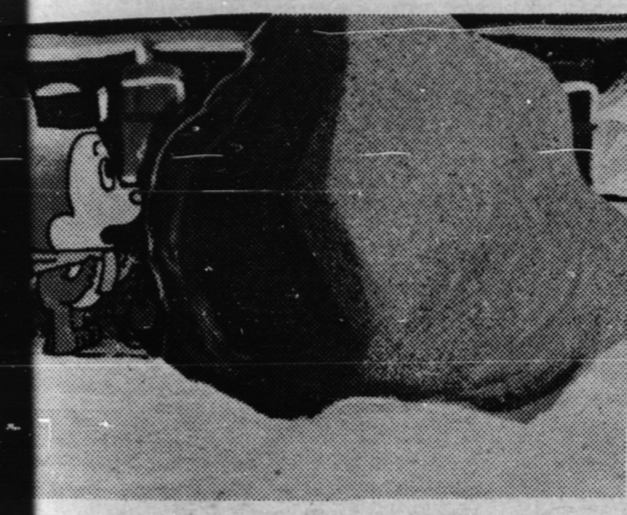

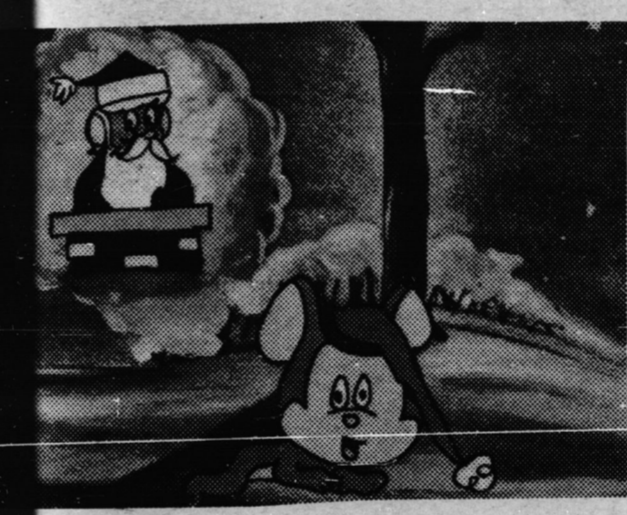

He is said to have the back of his hand better to see whether or not a child is good or nice.

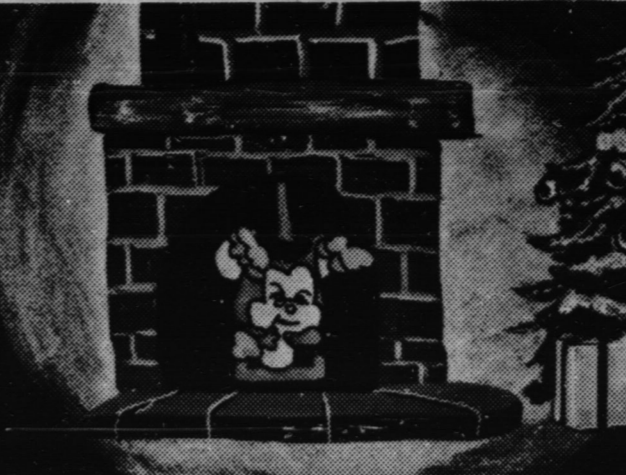
