

### Care For Your Eyes Is CNIB Message

"To be able to see is the greatest thing in the world," said Mrs. J. T. Patterson, National President of the Canadian Council of the Blind. In a special interview for the White Cane Week, Feb. 2-8, the president, who is blind herself, pointed out the need for readers to take care of their eyes. "Doctors state that early treatment could prevent fifty percent of Canada's blindness," she said in addition, according to the Board of the 10 provinces.

Each of these conditions of the eye occurs annually in industry alone. The figure does not include the injuries on the farm around the house or a school.

Because of these conditions the CCB and the Canadian National Institute for the Blind are dedicating their annual education project, to the importance of common sense eye care.

The president reviewed three important areas—research, knowledge and action—which contribute to good eye health. Research is under way on numerous levels in government, university and private science and the advance in eye medicine is considerable. The resulting new knowledge must spread to all concerned with sight preservation.

"Action is the application of knowledge already possessed," Mrs. Patterson said. She made a few suggestions for protecting your own sight.

"See your doctor at the first sign of trouble," she said. "This is the way to catch any eye condition in time."

"If you need glasses, use safety lenses. Many a man can see today because that hard lens took the brunt of the blow."

"If you have children, have the eye test early. Crossed eyes must be treated by the age of seven. The early check can mean the difference between normal vision and one-eyed seeing for the rest of a child's life."

"You cannot make a better resolution this White Cane Week," said Mrs. Patterson, "than to be wise disease.

hospital, whether large or small provides a high quality of test results as by their accuracy, and the subsequent physicians treatment, depends the improvement of the patients' illness and his eventual recovery.

Clinical laboratories, such as the one we have at West Haldimand General Hospital, are responsible for the progress of disease. Bacteriology, biochemistry, haematology, serology and histology. These areas can be broken down further as a department becomes larger and specialization takes place. Basically, bacteriology is the science and study of bacteria, and bacteria is large groups of unicellular, vegetable micro-organisms, existing as oval or spherical cells, rods, spirals and comma shaped organisms. These cells are either motile or non motile and exist mainly as parasites on living hosts. A small group of these are pathogenic and cause disease while most are non-pathogenic. Our next area is Biochemistry is the

chemistry of the living tissues and their connection with the prefix "haemo", in haematology, means pertaining to the blood and is derived from the Greek word haima which means blood. In this area we have the necessary blood grouping studies for transfusions and the studies of blood and blood components. The serology in Serology means it is relating to serum so Serology is the branch of science which deals with serum, this study enables the department to identify diseases based on characteristic reactions of various serums and also prepare serums used to treat these infectious diseases. It also includes studies of vaccines antibiotics and antitoxins. Histology is that branch of biology which deals with the minute structure of tissues and this department examines tissues to provide information on the cause and progress of disease.

This department, in our hospital is also responsible for the taking of electrocardiographs and forwarding them to an internist for interpretation. An electrocardiograph or E.C.G. machine is an instrument for making a record of small voltages, due to the beating heart, that exists between different parts of the body; this is recorded within the heart.
