Editorial Comment Red Tape Strangles Progress

Ontario's miles of red tape and jungle of bureaucracy is responsible for a big portion of the increase in prices for home building lots. In ending subsidies for services and streets in new subdivisions the provincial government has forced municipalities to adopt stiff bylaws regarding the setting up of new subdivisions. The subdivision is forced to include all the services in a package before he can start to sell any lots for home sites. This high cost is passed on to the man who wants to construct a new home and means an additional \$2,000 for his lot. In many cases it means a second mortgage situation before a family in the \$8,000 to \$10,000 bracket can even think about purchasing a home. On the one hand governments talk about doing something about low cost homes but on the other they continue through their own policies to drive the prices of homes up. The lack of flexibility and communication of Ontario's boards and commissions has been a big factor in the scarcity of building locations around new development areas. This is especially true for subdivisions designed for lower cost homes. After putting municipalities in the position where they had to make sure a developer had the funds to pay for the development of a subdivision with all services included the government has not done anything about helping to ensure that there are big enough services available to take care of the needs such as larger sanitary sewer plants. The Ontario Water Resources Commission announced it would take over ownership of sanitary sewage plants and systems of a municipality that desired this but have processed very few of the applications since it found that far more municipalities wanted this than the commission anticipated. The government advocates that planning is the answer to many of the problems that face municipalities but it seems the government seldom follows its own advice. It would help in the development of our community if the government would realize that this is an emergency situation and build more flexibility into the board's and commissions that will be handling the many applications for development in the area. One thing that should be considered are portable sanitary sewer facilities not septic tanks that could be discontinued after permanent plants are built. Street paving and other permanent fixtures could also be held up until after large enough facilities are constructed to handle all aspects that the development to the south will bring.

Wise, Unwise And Otherwise

The expression "power and authority" is common in law and has come to be recognized in every day language, so much so that many think the two words mean the same thing, but they do not. Prof. Robert A. Nisbet, in the Spectator of the 16th January last, says "no greater mistake can be made than to suppose they are the same." Usually, however, these two are associated because they are very similar in their ultimate expression. This is seen most clearly in the operation of the police. The police have power, physical force, to enforce the law of the land by arresting those who break these laws. This power lies partly in the fact that they are armed and well organized, but even more in the fact that they represent authority, the authority of the State. At one time, when the King was the absolute ruler, he was regarded as ruling by Divine Right; and his laws and decrees had the authority of God behind them. We no longer think in these terms, the State, in a democracy, gets its authority from the people. In Canada we still maintain the legal fiction of making our laws in the name of the Queen, but this is just a matter of convenience and custom. The police act in the name of the people and so represent the people. This ought to be kept in mind both by the police and those who attack them. The fact that power and authority are not the same is illustrated by the facts of every day politics. Chiang Kai Shek on the Island of Formosa claims the authority to rule over all China, but he has not got the power to do that. One of the greatest weaknesses of the United Nations is this same divorce between power and authority. The U.N. claims authority to make laws for its member states (called Resolutions) but it lacks any power to back up its claim to authority, as Canadians know very well. In Canada, and the Western world in general the balance of authority and power is pretty well recognized, though sometimes a Provincial or Federal government has been in office so long that they have come to think (unconsciously perhaps) that they have some kind of divine right to rule and can push the rest of us about as they please. They should beware - the last rulers by divine right, Charles I of England and Louis XVI of France, both lost their heads. What is really alarming is the present attitude of some students and others of defiance of authority. This defiance shows itself most openly in defiance of the authority of the state as represented by the police, but that is not the only example. There is defiance of the authority of the great artists and sculptors of the past, such as Leonardo da Vinci. This defiance results in the senseless paintings that we see around us and the production of such hideous sculptures as the Moore-monster in front of Toronto's City Hall. Likewise in literature the great writers of the past are no longer considered as authorities, so we get meaningless poetry and books that show that the author thinks that obscenity can take the place of good writing. And so on. This same defiance of authority often reveals itself in the home, in the school, in the Church but we all know something about that. Once the defiance of authority, in all these areas, goes too far chaos will result and a strong man will arise who will do away with all laws but his own and rule over the rest of us by brutal power, as the Russians are doing in Czechoslovakia.

During his European visit he will go to Brussels, now headquarters of NATO, London, Bonn, West Berlin, Rome and Paris. He will conclude his trip with a brief return to Rome for a meeting with Pope Paul. Nixon said he believes any summit talks, as proposed with the Soviet Union, should be preceded by the careful laying of groundwork. His visit to Europe would be part of this process. A court in New Orleans began hearing evidence in the trial of Clay L. Shaw, accused of conspiring with Lee Harvey Oswald, David Ferrie and others to murder President John F. Kennedy. The official Warren commission, which named Oswald as the sole perpetrator of the 1963 assassination in Dallas, Tex., became in effect a co-defendant when District Attorney Jim Garrison told the jury that he would show Kennedy "was struck by a number of bullets coming from different guns at different locations." Corrie C. Collins, a one-time civil rights worker who was a surprise witness, testified he saw Shaw, Oswald and Ferrie together in late August or early September, 1963. In Los Angeles, 12 jurors were sworn in to try Sirhan Bishara Sirhan, a 24-year-old Jordanian immigrant charged with murdering Senator Robert F. Kennedy last year.
