When you are newlywed the "family" Hospital Insurance premium must be paid to cover husband and wife. If you belong to a group without delay or if you both pay premiums direct, notify H.I.R.B.

When you move to a new job you can no longer be covered by your parents' Hospital Insurance. You must take out individual membership within 30 days. Get your application form at a bank, or a hospital, or from H.I.R.B.

When you have a new address notify your group. If you don't belong to a group, write H.I.R.B.

HOSPITAL COMMENTS

PHYSIOTHERAPY

A physiotherapist has been described as one who applies physical agents, (electricity, radiation, and heat), and principles (exercise and massage) to abnormal conditions, in order to promote a beneficial physiological response.

The responsibility for instituting physiotherapy treatment is that of the family physician. He is professionally assisted by the Chief Physiotherapist in determining the type and course of treatment. You may ask, which kind of medical condition physiotherapy is ordered for here are some of them.

Orthopaedic—Surgical and non-surgical—Arthritis, rheumatism, arthritis, fractures, postural deformities and amputations.

Obstetrics—Pre and post natal cases.

Pre and Post Operative—All general surgical cases including heart surgery.

Soft Tissue Injuries—Sprains, strains, contusions, lacerations, grafts, bed sores, ulcers, tendon repairs, and muscle spasms.

Medical chest conditions of the chest and heart diseases.

Circulatory diseases—arteriosclerosis, thrombosis, Buerger's disease, Raynaud's disease, etc.

Physiotherapy is utilized in neurology and neurosurgery also.

As you can see by the above list, physiotherapy can assist the physician in so many ways. Experience has shown that the length of stay in hospital can be very effectively shortened, and suffering can be substantially relieved by physiotherapy, thereby increasing the patient's morale and enabling him to be home with his family and back at his job in a period of time which would have astounded his grandparents.

During the four years since 1964 our hospital physiotherapy department gave over 50,000 treatments to outpatients in Haldimand County. These treatments covered a wide area of injuries and medical conditions and included sprains, congenital conditions, Parkinson's Disease, fractures, spinal conditions such as disc lesions, whiplash injuries, emphysema, asthma, bronchitis, polio-myelitis, club feet, sinus conditions and knee joint conditions, including cartilages.

Most people know that they shouldn't tow or push cars with automatic transmission for any distance. But not many know the reason. The Ontario Safety League explains that the automatic transmission is liable to become over-heated by friction because the oil pumps don't function properly to lubricate movable parts, if the engine is not running. Deaths have been reported where excessive heat built up in a car being towed a long distance, causing the gears to lock and fly apart, cracking the transmission housing, and leaving passengers with hot oil.
