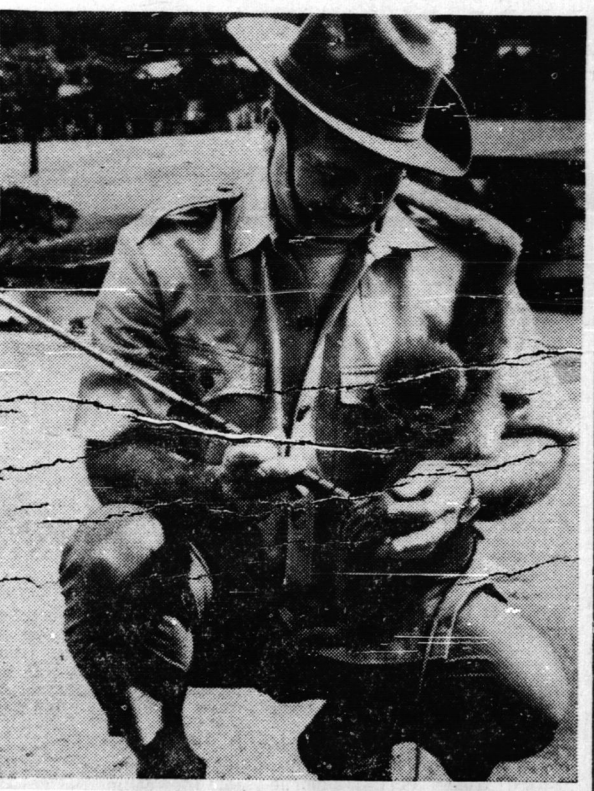

Two men were shot to death in front of their terrified wives on a deserted stretch of highway near Carp, Ont., in what one police veteran described as "the most bizarre incident" he had encountered.

Gerald MacDonald, 31, of Ottawa, and his brother-in-law, Kenneth Vallee, 42, of St. Clair Shores, Mich., were slain Friday night after their cars were flagged down by three young men in a third vehicle.

The three, wearing ski jackets, opened fire on MacDonald and Vallee as they approached a car occupied by the trio. The women were unharmed.

There was no apparent motive for the killings and the victims were not robbed.

One of the killers walked to one of the cars and struck the window with a rifle butt before the trio sped off in a late model car.

Inspector R. K. Chalmers of the Long Sault detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police, said the double shooting was "the most bizarre incident I've ever encountered."

Police said it appeared a shot gun and a .22-calibre rifle were used in the incident.

FORMER JUSTICE DIES
Ivan C. Rand, former justice of the Supreme Court of Canada and author of the Rand report, died of a heart attack in his office after walking up a hill to visit friends.

"He turned very pale and appeared to faint. It was over very quickly," Mr. Justice Rand became famous in labor relations for development of the Rand formula. In essence, this required non-union members to pay union dues in recognition of benefits received but did not require them to become union members. He had flown to London from Ottawa after spending Christmas with another son, Robert N. Rand, a civilian administrator with the defence department.
