To The Editor:

Since the Grape Workers strike started some three years ago there have been doubts in the minds of many individuals as to whether the plight of the grape workers is such, as has been reported in the Canadian Press.

Some three weeks ago a delegation of 32 Canadians from various walks of life (ministers, trade unionists, and other groups of social and welfare organizations) at considerable expense to themselves, journeyed to Coachella Valley and Delano area to find out for themselves if the problems of striking grape workers are valid.

One of the people of that group was Rev. Robert Wright, of Welland, Ontario, who has brought back a firsthand picture of the situation, including slides.

The growers have become desperate and are opposing Cesar Chavez and the farm workers more strenuously than previously. They even went to the extreme of flying in three Canadians to try and counter the impact of the trip. A bit more effort on our part (as Canadians) is what is needed in order to make the boycott complete and effectively conclude the grape strike, winning contracts for the very deserving grape strikers.

To enable the public to understand the conditions of the Grape Workers, Rev. Robert Wright has agreed to speak at a public meeting on Thursday, July 3, 1969, at 8:00 p.m. at the I.O.O.F. (Friendship) Hall, Caithness Street, East, Caledonia.


