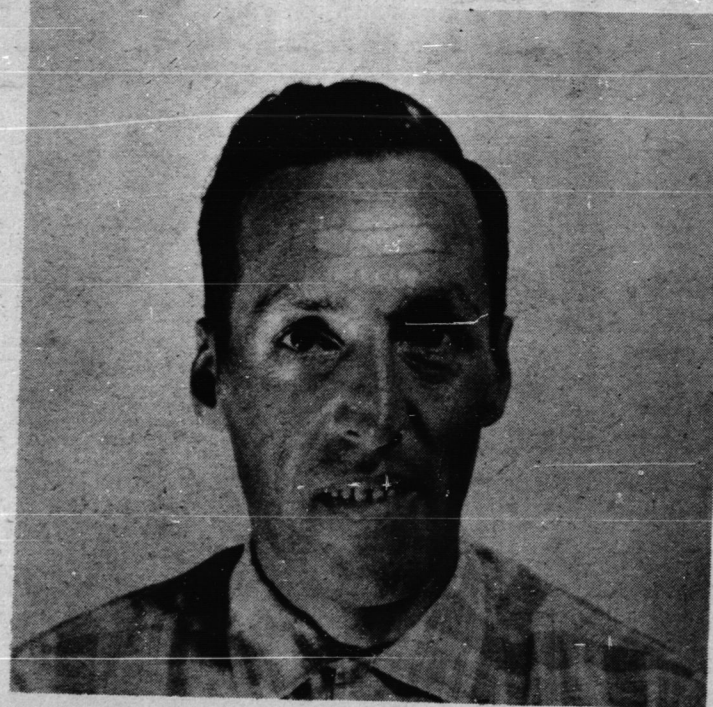

July 31st is the closing date for entries in the Haldimand 150 Bushel Corn Competition. The committee members from the Soil and Crop Improvement Association and the Dunnville Chamber of Commerce are looking for the largest entry ever. It is pointed out that in a difficult crop year such as this, there is even more to be learned from participation. Entry forms are available from directors of the Soil and Crop Improvement Association.

## Canadian Chamber Of Commerce Annual Meeting

Top government and business leaders will be among the speakers at the 40th annual meeting of the Canadian Chamber of Commerce in Halifax, N.S., Sept. 28 to Oct. 1.

The Honorable Jean-Luc Pepin, minister of industry, trade and commerce and The Honorable George I. Smith, premier of Nova Scotia, will be luncheon speakers at the four-day convention.

G.A.R. Hart, chairman of The Bank of Montreal, will be delegates and wives expected to attend the chamber's session annual dinner Oct. 1.

Theme of this 40th annual gathering of Canada's parliament of business is Social and Economic Responsibility and the Challenge of topics as youth, employment, housing, inflation and welfare will be discussed in depth.

In addition, delegates from boards of trade and chambers of commerce across the country will decide the coming year and will elect a new slate of officers.

The meeting will commence the afternoon of Sept. 28 with opening remarks by Canadian Chamber President A. Searle Leach, followed by words of welcome from G.B. Robertson, president of The Halifax Board of Trade and W.J. Hancox, president of the Maritime Provinces Board of Trade.

The first panel discussion of the convention, entitled The Quest of Youth, will feature addresses by H.D. Cruickshank of Montreal, vice-president of public relations for Bell Canada and R.S. Ritchie, a director of Imperial Oil Limited of Toronto. A university student will also take part in this session.

A panel discussion entitled The Social and Economic Challenges will be featured Sept. 30 and will be broken down into three sections. The address the more than 900 delegates and wives expected to attend the chamber's session annual dinner Oct. 1.

Later that day, another discussion will take place, this one entitled The Social and Economic Implications of Inflation. Speakers include J.R. Beattie, deputy governor of The Bank of Canada, Professor D.S. Leighton of the School of Business Administration, University of Western Ontario, and P.E. Leach, followed by words of welcome from G.B. Robertson, president of The Halifax Board of Trade and W.J. Hancox, president of the Maritime Provinces Board of Trade.
