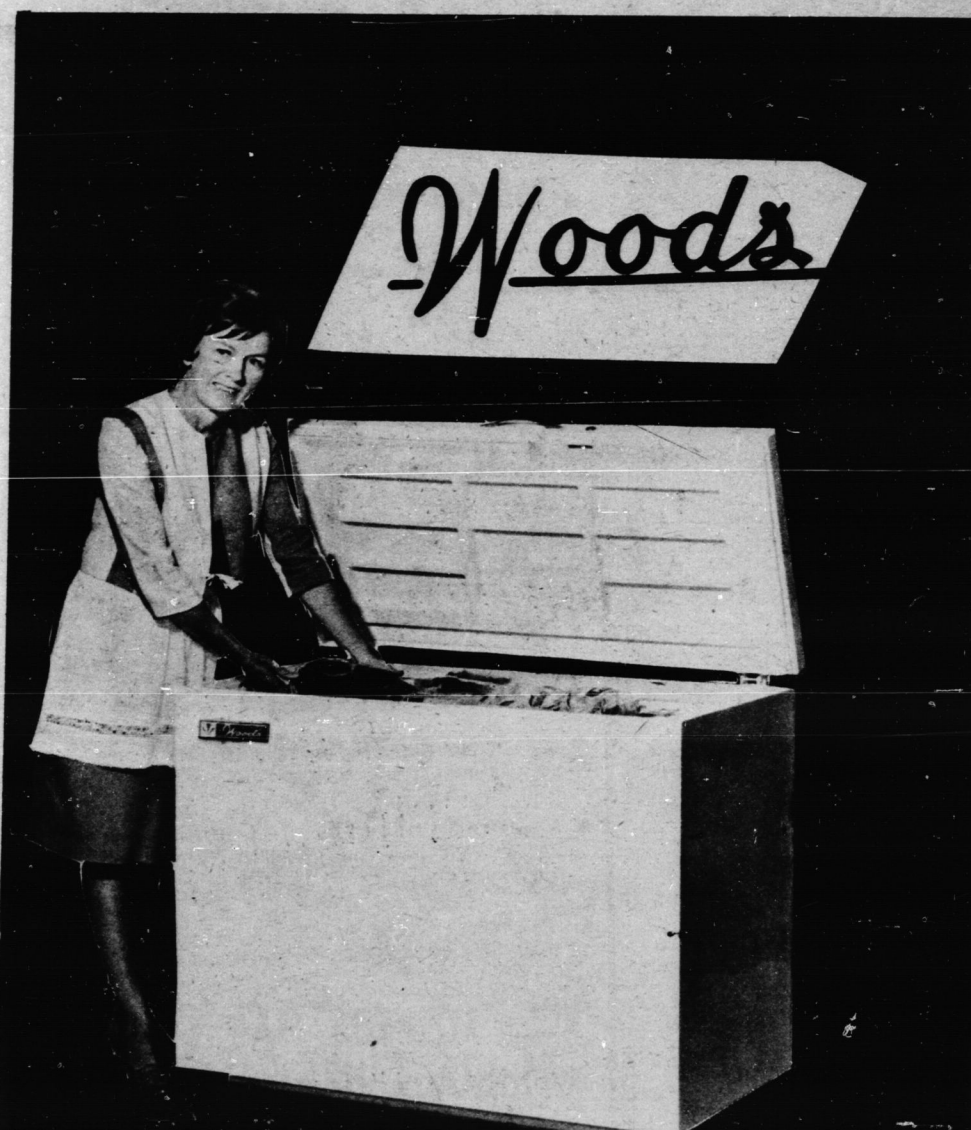

Quinn and D. Smith each had two for the losers and Gary Lane added a singleton.

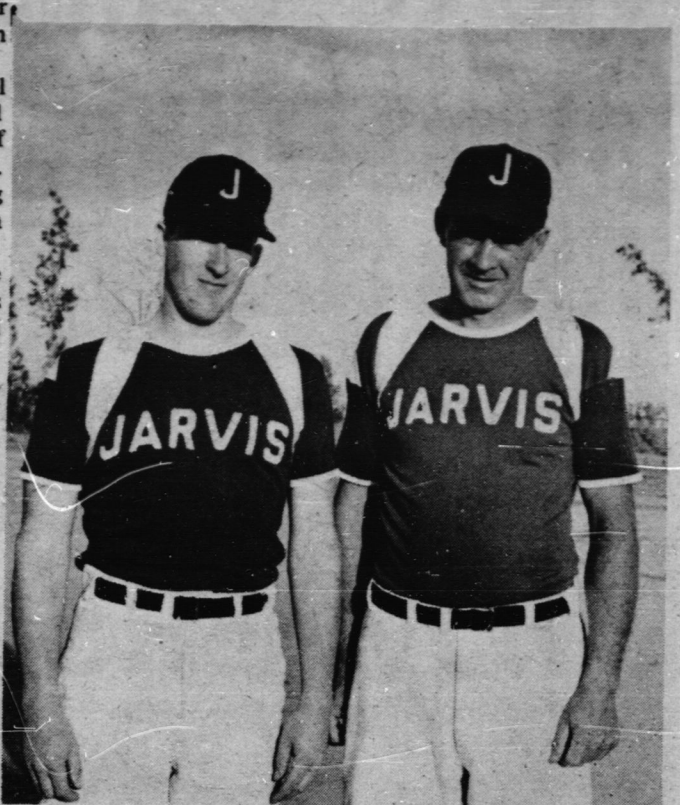
Monday night's game in Smithville was rained out and the next action for the Merchants will be Saturday night when Pyettes will be here at 8:30 p.m.
