McGaws Corners

Spring has again brought into focus the Wilson MacDonald Memorial School Museum and the birthplace of the Late Wilson MacDonald, Canada's greatest Lyric Poet, at Cheapside.

The Museum grounds park is a "thing of beauty" since the lawn mower has been in action. Picnic tables again hold out an invitation to picnicking families. Two new flags, Canada's Maple Leaf and the Union Jack have been flying proudly since May 24.

Inside the museum is being readied for "Open House" on Sunday, June 15, two p.m. to four p.m. It will be open each Sunday through June, July, August, September, until October 15, after the Thanksgiving holiday.

No formal ceremony is planned this year, since we have become established in the area as a museum. We do hope to keep the public informed by way of the press and radio of the various activities.

Several bus loads including a number of Women's Institute groups, church auxiliary groups, historical societies and various others visited us. The attendance is recorded and both years we have entertained over 1,000 guests.

The park is a quiet retreat, the perfect place to enjoy a family lunch, a wayside rest, or a "peep into the past."

We, the Haldimand County Museum Board, invite you to join the many who come to this memorial museum, the 1872 one room, red brick school house, formerly S.S. No. 2 McGaws, now a memorial to one who gave and left a great heritage to his country. Even so, little has been known about this great man of poetry.

Cheapside (London England) is remembered by the Poet Chaucer for his "Canterbury Tales." Cheapside Ontario will have a lasting memorial to our poetic son in this school museum whose birthplace is one mile north of the museum, in the hamlet where it has been said "if you sneeze at the wheel, you will be through it without seeing it." The first year of his learning was obtained at S.S. No. 2 McGaws, where we now immortalize the memory of Cheapside's son.
