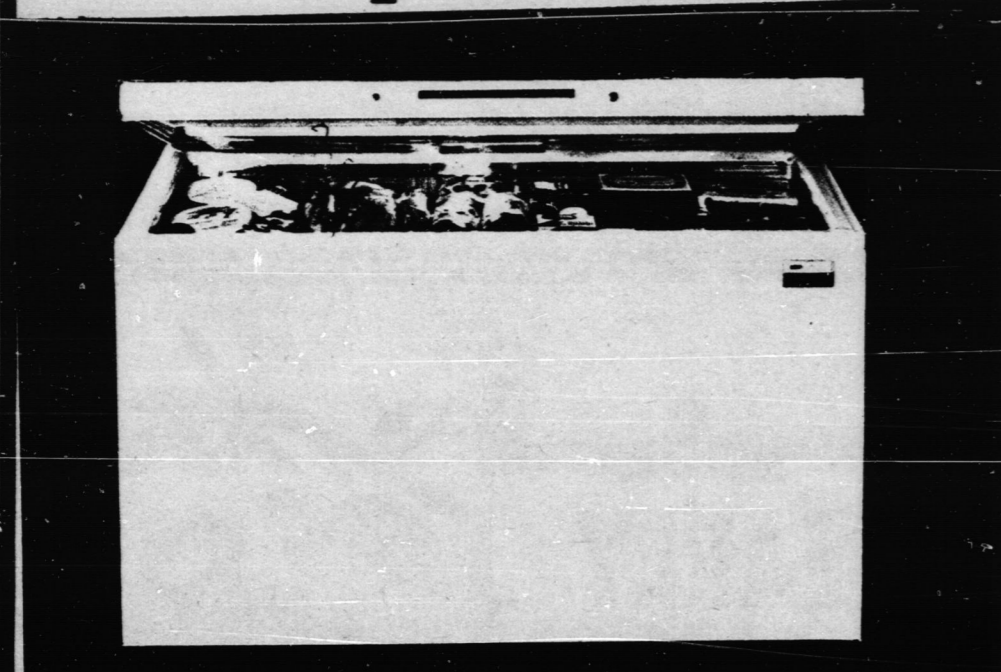

Obituary

WILLIAM ELLIOTT

A well known resident of the Village of Jarvis passed away in the West Haldimand General Hospital at Hagersville, Ont. on May 28, 1969, following a lengthy illness. He was born in the township of Blenheim, Waterloo County, May 31, 1889 and at an early age moved to Dunnville, Ont. where he served his apprenticeship as a plumber and tinsmith with Mr. Otto. While residing in Dunnville he was married to Christine Vogelmann who predeceased him on November 25, 1918.

On June 24, 1925, he was married to Clara Eva Reicheld (nee Culp) and moved to Jarvis where he purchased the business of Alfred Owens which he operated for many years and which is now known as W.J. Elliott & Son. In the same year he founded the Jarvis Fire Department serving as Fire Chief for a number of years and subsequently as Honorary Fire Chief. He also served as a member of the municipal council of the Village of Jarvis. He was ordained an Elder in the Presbyterian Church in Canada and was inducted into Knox Session on April 6, 1952.

He is survived by his widow Clara Elliott, six children, William Os Simcoe, Merie and Howard of Jarvis, Mrs. Ernest Braund (Madeline) of Jarvis, Mrs. A.G. Kightley (Nellie) of Welland, Mrs. Robert Fitch (Shirley) of Lindsay, and nine grandchildren. He is also survived by two brothers, Mr. C. Taylor of Mesa Arizona, David E. Taylor of Cleveland, Ohio, and three sisters, Mrs. Stewart Lashbrook (Margaret), Mrs. Allen McDougal (Elizabeth), Mrs. Basil Wickham (Helen) all of Dayton Ohio.

Mr. Elliott rested at the Hyde and Mott Funeral Home, Hagersville until May 31, where services were conducted in the chapel at 2 p.m. by the Rev. G. Taylor-Munro with interment following in Knox Presbyterian Church Cemetery Jarvis.

Acting as pall bearers were Geo. Walker, Stanley Mitchell, Ernest Craddock, Alfred Walker, Alex Duncan, Gordon Miller.

Floral bearers were members of the Jarvis Fire Department.

Conservation Authority Ponds in Welland, Norfolk, Middlesex and Lambton Counties - Rainbow Trout 12,900;

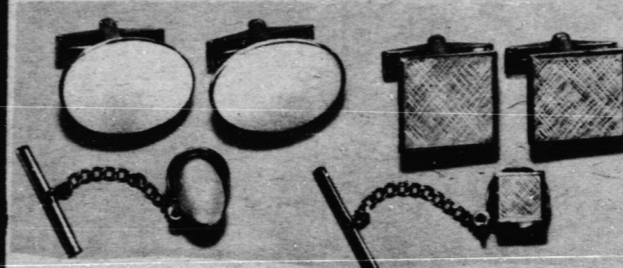

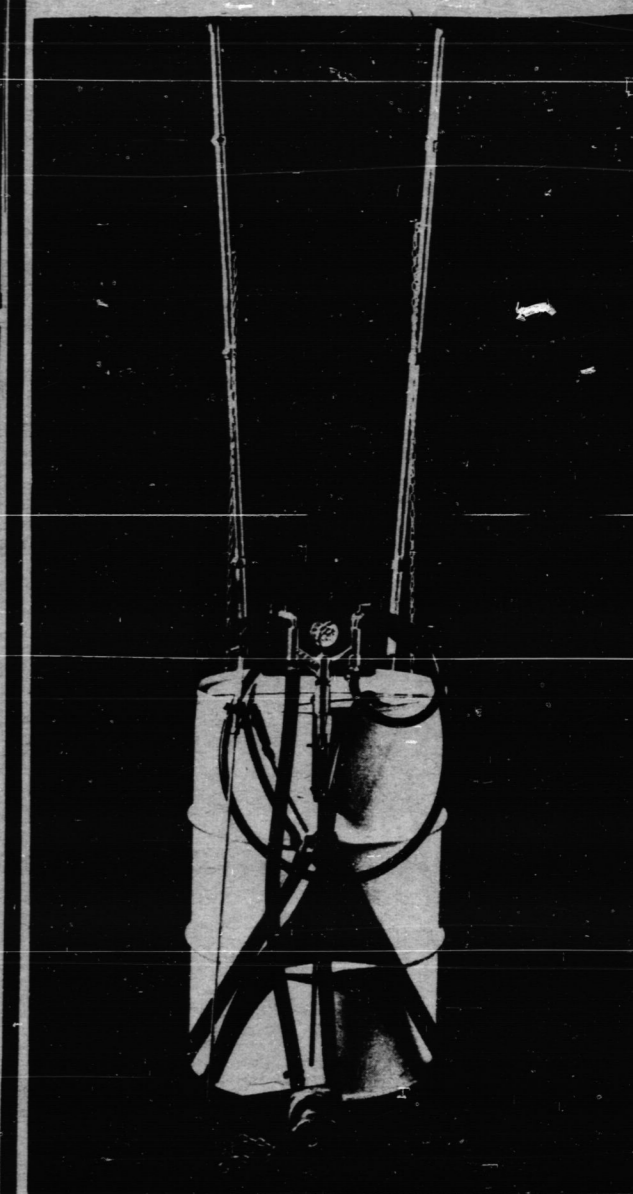
