the community saw the completion of the West Haldimand Hospital in Hagersville. In 1964 he relinquished the chairmanship of the Board and was appointed Chairman of the Expansion Committee.

Mr. Miller was keenly interested in all levels of politics from the Municipal to the Federal level of Government. He was an elected member of the Jarvis Village Council from 1936 to 1946 and served as Reeve of the Village from 1943 to 1946. He was elected President of the Haldimand Progressive Conservative Association in 1950, succeeding the late Mr. B.L. Edgecombe, and continued to serve as President until 1967. In 1960 he was elected President of the Brant Haldimand Progressive Conservative Association when the Federal ridings were redistributed and continued until 1967. During his tenure he actively campaigned for the Honourable James N. Allen, M.L.A., Mr. Earl Catherwood, and Mr. John A. Charlton.

Fraternally he devoted himself to the Masonic Order and had been a member of the King Solomon Lodge

He was an adherent of the Wesley United Church in Jarvis and took an active interest in the Board of Stewards on which he served as Chairman for a 6 year period and as secretary for a further four years. During the building of the Christian Education Center he served as Chairman of the Finance committee.

His other interests included the Childrens Aid Society, of which he was a member of the executive, the Jarvis Community Chest Fund, and the Canadian Arthritis and Rheumatism Society.
