"The Founding Convention and subsequent annual meetings of the GFO must ratify, modify or reject bylaws made by the Provincial Coucil.

"The legislation provides for the holding of annual and special conventions and for the election of delegates to these meetings. Bill 140 specifies that the Provincial Council must make a full report to annual meetings, including a certified financial statement. The legislation even provides for dissolution of the organization at the request of producers.

"When we recognize that three delegates will be elected for every 1,000 farmers or a major part thereof, we can realize that the GFO will be more representative of individual farmers than any organization we have had to


