Besides the young and old, the group includes many young adults and middle aged people, in the hope that all shades of opinion and points of view will be represented.

are ready for it and desire it. After prayer, mutual introductions, and brief opening business, the group settled down to a remarkably frank and stimulating conversation. The chairman called upon each group member in turn to state briefly his attitude to the proposed union, and to mention specifically his most serious objections or reservations. Nearly all of the members said they were basically in favour. But one United Church clergyman and one Anglican lay person declared that they were absolutely opposed, and would form part of a third splinter church if the union came about.

Why were they opposed? The Anglican insisted that he loved his United Church brethren and recognized them as legitimate Christians, but found United Church gatherings utterly devoid of a sense of worship. His love for the traditional liturgy, church hangings and vestments would keep him out of any union with the United Church. Also, he said, he wanted in a clergyman not a "buddy", but a priest. The United Church clergyman said he would oppose such a union because of his loyalty to the Methodist-Reformed tradition of doctrine and worship. He felt there was no Biblical or theological necessity that all Christians should be together in one organically united church.
