Reeve Ernest Craddock attended the meeting and told the Board there are two 48-acre sites planned for subdivisions.

"At present they are awaiting approval from the OMB and two to three months should see them off the ground" he said.

"Right now there are no places for commercial sites in town" he added.

Mr. Craddock told the Board that the 5-year study of the Niagara Economical Region has Jarvis on top of the list for residential units.

In reply to suggestions of what the Board should work towards he said "We must be competitive with our neighbours or they will take us over."

"When you are outnumbered 2-1 on a committee you must grow right along with them," he said.

While discussing the housing situation Mr. Craddock gave some figures on the numbers of employees working at the Na tickoe Generating Station and where they are living.

"At present there are 507 men employed at the site, 88 are living in Simcoe, 82 in particulars.

Port Dover and only 16 are living in Jarvis. Jack Cooke said "our biggest problem is accommodations and at present we are being strangled by the OMB".

Reeve Craddock said "it wouldn't hurt a bit" to write to Darcy McKeough Minister of Municipal Affairs, to find out what the reason is for the delay.

Several projects were discussed at the meeting and all were referred to their respective committees for development. These included parking, drinking fountains, and park benches.

President Williamson expressed the hope that several of these will be carried out during the summer.

The next meeting will be held on August 18, 1969.

The Unemployment Insurance Commission has passed on answers to some of the questions that have puzzled contributors. Your question too can be referred to this feature for reply.

Q. When I phoned the Unemployment Insurance Office to inquire how much money they are paying my husband, they refused to give me this information.

Should I not be entitled to it? After all I have to keep the home going.

A. Any information received from a claimant or registrant must be treated as confidential. This is laid down in the Unemployment Insurance Act. Such information cannot be divulged without written consent of the claimant. To enforce this section of the Act each employee of the Commission has taken an oath of secrecy.

Q. I am a member of my provincial legislature and I plan to seek the leadership of my party at a convention before the next election. To prepare my campaign I shall be hiring a number of workers for approximately three months.

Will these workers be covered by Unemployment Insurance?

A. No, they will not be insurable because such work is excepted from coverage. The Unemployment

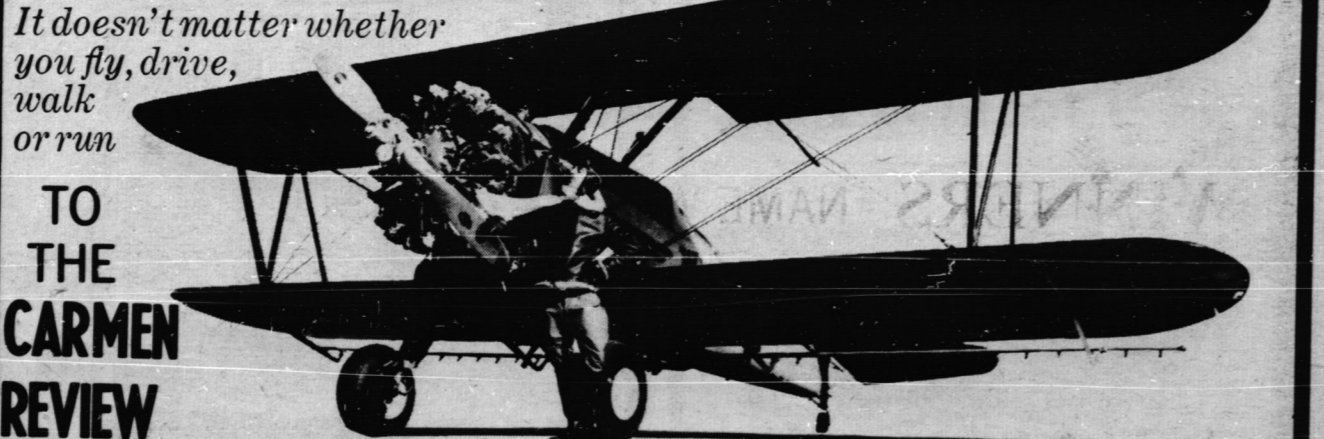

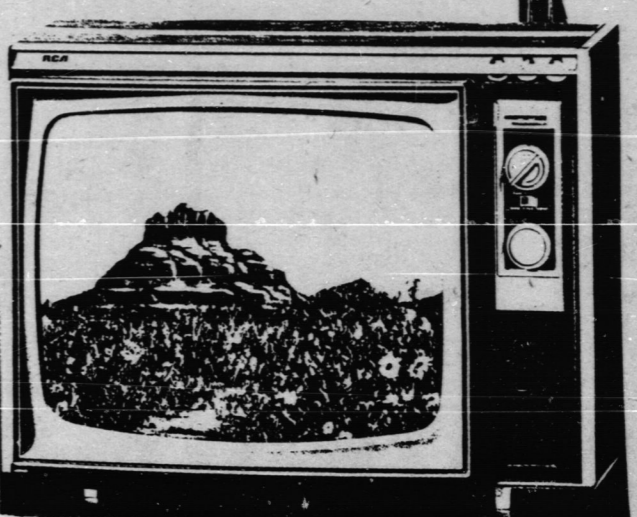
