Teatime Topics

In some situations you may find better housing for less money if you rent rather than buy. The reverse of all or any of these conditions may be buying a better arrangement for you, if you have enough money, know the neighborhood and expect to be in one place for a while.

Whether you rent an apartment, a house or a duplex or townhouse unit, be sure you read the lease before you sign it. Know what is covered by rent, who is responsible for upkeep and repairs, how and when the lease expires, how would it affect you? Are there extra costs you must pay such as security deposits, rent increases, penalties for late payment?

Know building rules and regulations, whether the landlord is responsible for damage to your property, whether he has a lien against it. Don't rely on verbal agreements, be sure any and all rental conditions are written down.

If you are buying or building, it is recommended that you get expert advice. When you choose a real estate agent, look for the term realtor, which is used only by persons or agencies belonging to the Canadian Association of Real Estate Brokers. Members agree to follow a code of ethics.

You will probably want a lawyer who is reliably recommended. If you need an architect, hire a man who is recommended, and shop around. Do not ask for sketches until you are ready to pay for them.

If you hire a contractor, you may be wise to check with the Better Business Bureau and with the local branch of the National House Builders Association before you commit yourself.

Municipalities Voice Approval

Officials of many municipalities of the two-county area voiced approval of Ontario's willingness to commit itself to building a model community out of this virgin area within the next decade.

Warden Ernest Craddock said, "planning is the first and most important step to get an orderly growth for our area. Once the bugs are ironed out it could then be decided what municipalities within the region should be joined."

Warden Blake Lefler of Norfolk said Mr. McKeough's proposals look "favorable." He said I don't think that we have a choice about eventually having regional government. "I think that it's time our two counties go together and go to work," he said. To that we say amen.

Ontario Has A Plan

The story has been unfolded and the speculation has ended on what the Ontario government had in store for our area. Municipal Affairs Minister Darcy McKeough in his announcement to a meeting here Monday of stationing a permanent staff in the area to help co-ordinate planning for Haldimand-Norfolk may speed the process of getting an overall plan.

It was welcome news indeed that the Ontario government will veto any plan for a satellite city in the Haldimand-Norfolk area. It was also indicated the government will promote growth in the areas where growth has started such as at our existing towns and villages.

Mr. McKeough said that all departments of the government will be co-ordinating in their efforts to promote good planning for the area through Nigel Richardson, who will act as technical and administration head, and be stationed in the district.

It was also interesting to note that Mr. McKeough indicated that power that have been taken away from municipalities in the past will be given back through a regional government plan. This will be interesting indeed. Maybe we have been off on the wrong track on the whole concept of regional government.

Regional Study Meeting

More Smokers In Britain. Statistics presented by the British Tobacco Advisory Committee show the number of cigarettes smoked in the United Kingdom during 1968 to be greater than ever before, but the amount of tobacco required in their manufacture to be the lowest since 1956. The situation is caused by increased consumer demand for filter tipped and smaller sized cigarettes. Filter tips now account for over 70 per cent of all cigarette sales in the U.K. The total number of cigarettes smoked in 1968 was 2700 million more than in the previous year. Total cigarette consumption amounted to 121,800 million cigarettes. On the other hand cigarette manufacture dropped from 221.3 million pounds to 220.2 million pounds.
