Monitors Will Keep Tabs On Pollution

SIMCOE - Any increase in air pollution after new industries are in operation will be detected by an air pollution monitoring system to be installed in Norfolk County this spring. Irving Kleiman, recently re-elected president of the Norfolk Federation of Agriculture, said last week the Ontario Air Pollution Control Centre in Toronto has agreed to install the monitoring system at the request of the federation.

The Ontario Hydro generating station and the planned Steel Company of Canada plant near Nanticoke are most likely to cause any rise in air pollution, said Mr. Kleiman. The hydro station will be in partial operation by 1971 and one phase of the Stelco operation will begin production in 1972. Mr. Kleiman said the monitoring system will make an accurate measurement of air pollution over the county before these plants begin production for comparison with conditions afterwards.

Four Injured In Highway Crash

CAYUGA - Four people were injured in a crash 10 miles east of here on Highway 3 Saturday.

James McConnell, 59, the driver received chest injuries and face cuts. His wife, Gertrude, 62, received two fractured legs and severe cuts to her face; Ambrose Fagan, 55, face cuts and Mrs. Fagan, 50, face cuts and concussion. All are of Cayuga.
