Apples in pancakes? Why not? The little touch of nutmeg and grated apple add to the flavor and appearance of the pancakes, say home economists at Macdonald institute, University of Guelph. Apple pancakes are excellent for breakfast or brunch.

Apple Pancakes 11/2 Cups all-purpose flour 3 teaspoons baking powder [teaspoon salt

3 tablespoons sugar ¼ teaspoon nutmeg 1/3 teaspoon baking soda solved in I teaspoor

warm water

3 tablespoons melted butter ¼ teaspoon vanilla

1 Cup milk 1 cup grated raw apple

Mix and sift dry ingredients. In a separate bowl, beat egg thoroughly and add milk. Make a well in enter of dry ingredients. Slowly add egg and milk mixture. Add melted butter, flavoring, and apple. Stir in baking soda dissolved in water.

Cook the pancakes until they are filled with bubbles, then turn and cook on the other side. Serve piping hot with ham.
