Smoke Bomb Found

SIMCOE — An 18-pound-smoke bomb was found last week on the Woodhouse Township dump, five miles south of here.

Provincial police said it was a Second World War bomb.

A bomb disposal officer defused it and took it to the Canadian forces base at London.

Harvey Bayes of Simcoe and his father, Leon, township employees, found the bomb.

"We noticed it between some wooden slats," Harvey said.

"There was a tag on it saying 'do not pull pin.' The pin was still in it."

Police believe someone had dropped the bomb from Lake Erie.

Aircraft from the old air force base at Hagersville, flew over Lake Erie on practice bombing runs during the Second World War.

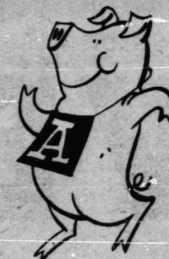

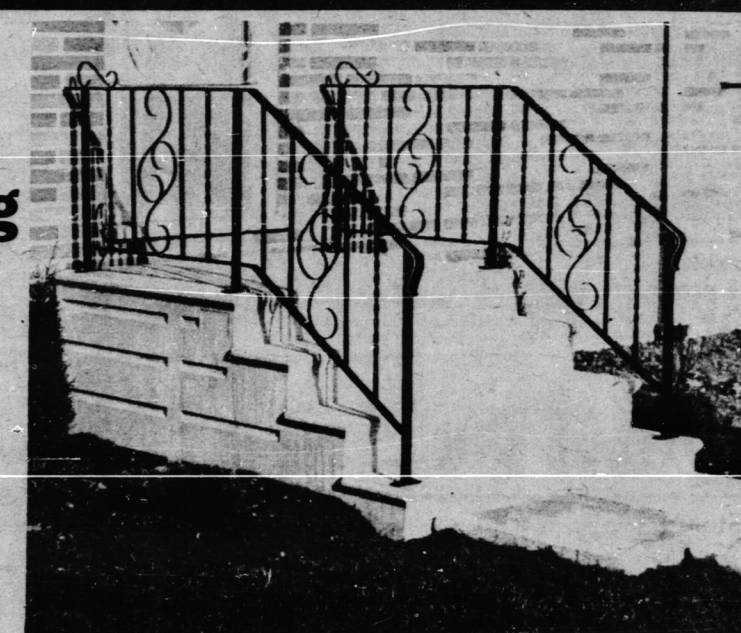
